GOVERNOR RELEASES MAY BUDGET REVISION

On May 14, the Governor released his May revision to the proposed 2015-16 budget. Below are a few items to note such as an increase to funded growth from 2% to 3%, a decrease to COLA, increase to support full-time faculty hiring, increase to base allocation, increase to one-time funds, increase to Block grant, and increase to Student Equity.

There are still many details that the State Chancellor's Office needs to clarify; however, we can use some of the assumptions (such as funded growth and COLA) in order to finalize a conservative Tentative Budget. Once the State Chancellor's Office has clarified the funding levels for our District, we will incorporate into the Final Budget.

We will continue to work with Chancellor's Cabinet, District Budget Committee and the colleges to have a tentative budget that represents these revisions.

The key highlights of the Governor's revised budget relevant to the California Community Colleges are as follows:

- \$49.7 million to increase access from 2 percent to 3 percent (\$156.5M total for 2015-16).
- A decrease of \$31.3 million to reflect a downward adjustment in the COLA from 1.58% to 1.02%
- \$75 million to support an increase in full-time faculty hiring. Funding would be allocated per FTES, but districts with relatively low proportions of full-time faculty would be required to hire more than districts with relatively high proportions of full-time faculty.
- \$141.7 million in additional funds for support of district general operating expenses, bringing the proposed total to \$266.7 million for the 2015-16 fiscal year.

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- \$274.7 million in additional one-time funds to pay down prior mandate obligations, bringing the proposed total to \$626 million. These funds would distributed on a per-FTES basis.
- \$148 million for deferred maintenance and instructional equipment. Of this amount, \$48 million is attributable to the current fiscal year. No local match is required.
- \$60 million in one-time funds for the Basic Skills and Student Outcomes Transformation Program. These funds are intended to improve basic skills instruction through adoption and/or expansion of evidence-based models of placement, remediation, and student support that will aid the progress and success of basic skills students. More detail will be available in the forthcoming trailer bill.
- \$15 million increase for Student Equity Plan funding, bringing the total proposed increase to \$115 million for the 2015-16 fiscal year. Concurrently, provisional language will require the implementation of SB 1023 (Liu, 2014), which authorizes a pilot program to provide additional support of foster youth who participate in EOPS.
- \$15 million increase for the Institutional • Effectiveness Partnership Initiative. Of this amount, \$3 million will go toward technical assistance and the remaining \$12 million is for the development and dissemination of effective practices. Provisional language would prioritize development of curriculum and practices for members of the California Conservation Corps and for inmates pursuant to SB 1391 (Hancock, 2014). There will also be language included in

the budget encouraging districts to offer up funding to enhance inmate education efforts.

- \$2.5 million to fund the COLA for the EOPS, DSPS, CalWORKs, and the Childcare Tax Bailout programs.
- \$2 million in one-time funds for a pilot program to foster collaboration between colleges and CSU campuses relating to basic skills instruction for incoming CSU students.
- A decrease of \$825,000 in energy efficiency funding pursuant to the California Clean Energy Jobs Act (Proposition 39, 2012). This reduces the amount available in 2015-16 to \$38.7 million.
- \$25 million increase in Proposition 98 funds for the Awards in Innovation in Higher Education. This would bring the proposed total funding to \$50 million for the 2015-16 fiscal year (half Prop 98, half non-98). The May Revision would also reclassify \$23 million in current year awards as Proposition 98 funds, reflecting awards coordinated bv community colleges. The May Revision further proposes to allow community colleges may be lead applicants for awards.
- The May Revision makes various other adjustments to the general apportionment, such as the inclusion of funding for projected FTES restoration and revised estimates concerning property taxes and fee revenues.
- Concerning the adult education proposal, forthcoming trailer bill will propose various modifications, perhaps most notably the elimination of the allocation boards that were proposed in January. Each consortium will instead



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be required to propose a transparent governance structure for joint approval Superintendent by the of Public Instruction and by the Chancellor. It will no longer be required that each consortium have a fiscal agent, allowing for direct funding of member agencies if so desired. Language will also specify and clarify various reporting and funding deadlines. More information will be provided on these changes as details become available in the trailer bill. See page 8.

POLICIES & PROCEDURES UPDATE

At the April 7 District Assembly Meeting, the body agreed with the recommendation of the ACCJC Ad Hoc Task Force to place the review process, of all policies and procedures, on hold until the fall. The rationale for the pause is that the current process does not allow time for meaningful review and input. The pause will be in effect until the fall at which time a joint ad-hoc committee of the ACCJC District Recommendation Task Force and District Assembly will propose a new process for the timely and meaningful review of Board Policies and Procedures. Volunteers were sought and include Donna Ferracone, Glen Kuck, Larry Aycock, Cassandra Thomas, Benjamin Gamboa, Keith Wurtz, and Stacey Nikac.

On May 19, the BP/AP Approval Process subcommittees of the District Assembly and the ACCJC District Recommendations Task Force had their second meeting that included John Stanskas and Denise Allen-Hoyt. The proposed revisions BP/AP 2410 are attached along with a tracking tool that the joint subcommittee developed. Chancellor's Cabinet reviewed and supported the recommendations.

One key change of AP 2410 is the addition of the following language:

Each year the Chancellor will notify the appropriate parties of the chapters or specific BPs or APs to be reviewed.

Responsibility for the review process is as follows:

- Chapter 1: Chancellor and Board of Trustees
- Chapter 2: Chancellor and Board of Trustees
- Chapter 3: Chancellor and Chancellor's Cabinet
- Chapter 4: Vice-Presidents of Instruction, Student Services, and Academic Senate Presidents
- Chapter 5: Vice-Presidents of Instruction, Student Services, and Academic Senate Presidents
- Chapter 6: Vice-Chancellor of Fiscal Services and Vice-Presidents of Administrative Services
- Chapter 7: Vice-Chancellor of Human Resources

As you can see from this updated language, there will be full or joint responsibility for ensuring our District's BP/APs are reviewed and approved in a timely basis. A meeting will be scheduled with those who are responsible for the review process to ensure there is a full understanding of what is expected and to review and prioritize BP/APs for review. The end goal is to be able to provide the District Assembly with a comprehensive BP/AP approval process that is not only ready to be approved, but also ready for immediate



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implementation upon approval. See pages 9 & 11.

SBVC PASSES INSPECTION

HAY GROUP CLASSIFICATION & COMPENSATION STUDY

Hay Group Study Update

Nearly two years ago, The Hay Group was selected to conduct a classification and compensation study for the San Bernardino Community College District. The report is undergoing the final stages of preparation. The scope of the study addresses the classification of positions in relation to commensurate salaries among seven similar sized community college districts. The selected districts include (Chaffey, Mt. San Antonio, Mt. San Jacinto, Desert Community, Palomar, Riverside, and Victor Valley). During the study process there was several delays that occurred. For example, the salary database included overtime and longevity pay which threw-off the calculations and was not immediately discovered by participants in the process.

From this report, SBCCD will be positioned to assess classifications and related salaries based on the market's median salary range within each position. In addition, the study will also address the efficiency and effectiveness of the existing salary schedules. Once the findings have been provided to the district, the outcome will be presented for review and discussion amongst all groups. This process will be instituted to provide a transparent approach of how the district compares in relation to the market and how it can define a strategic plan in moving forward to ensure equity standards are being met within SBCCD positions. While the study will include





information showing some classifications below market range and some above market range, any process to make adjustments must go through the collective bargaining process and sustainable funding must be identified.

We look forward to finally having the results of the study for discussion with the constituent groups. • Yucaipa's State of the City really 'Polishes the Gem"

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May Budget Revision, Advance Talking Points

- Community colleges offer open access to serve the public's need for higher education, and, for many Californians, they provide the best chance to escape poverty.
- More than half of our 2.1 million students are financially needy and threefourths need remedial education. Approximately 40 percent of our students are first-generation college students.
- Community colleges are still recovering from the deep cuts that occurred during the recession. In fact, the total number of course sections offered remains lower than the number of sections offered in 2007-08.
- Inflation has taken a bite out of our colleges. Funding for our system is now \$1 billion lower than if funding had kept pace with inflation over the past seven years.
- At the same time, Community colleges have been asked to do more, and we are rising to the challenge. We are expanding on-line instruction, starting to offer baccalaureate degrees on a pilot basis, expanding prison education and taking on more responsibility for Adult Education. All this is on top of our core mission of offering basic skills education, workforce development and transfer preparation.
- In the past few budgets, colleges have received welcomed funding increases to beef up student services and success efforts. These are imperative for increasing student success but do not address operational needs, which suffer due to the impact of foregone COLAs.
- Further, colleges face significant challenges due to scheduled increases in employer STRS and PERS contributions that will divert discretionary funding by over \$400M annually when fully implemented.
- We are restoring access to our colleges and focusing on helping students succeed in greater numbers. Additional resources will ensure that we meet the need for providing high levels of service to our students and the public.
