## New California Community College system chancellor to start Dec. 19

"We're going to take on a much more aggressive agenda with a clear lens on social justice and equity," said Eloy Ortiz Oakley, who is in his final weeks as head of the Long Beach Community College District, in an interview with *The Atlantic*. "I don't think there is a greater equalizer than California community colleges," he said. Oakley will take the helm as Chancellor of California's 113 community colleges on Dec. 19 and replace Brice W. Harris, who retired earlier this year after leading the community college system for nearly four years. Erik E. Skinner will continue serving as interim chancellor until Oakley takes office.

# SBCCD's partnership with Caltrans is a statewide model to help ex-offenders gain new job skills

SBCCD manages a major grant for the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation that provides work experience for parolees at Caltrans locations. Eddie Rubio, SBCCD's Caltrans Program Administrator, spoke about the success of the program with statewide leaders at the Reentry Solutions People, Program and Policy conference in Ontario, hosted by the San Francisco Federal Reserve Bank. Rubio was on a panel of experts and shared that noncredit programs, coupled with for-credit programs, go hand-in-hand with creating a pathway that eases the process for ex-offenders to pursue their education. This multi-agency effort creates a new start for individuals, while increasing public safety.

### SBCCD meets the 50 percent law

Since 1961. California state law has required each community college district to allocate no less than 50 percent of its general fund expenditures to "salaries of classroom instructors," under a formula based upon the current expense of education. SBCCD continues to meet the legal requirements of the "Fifty Percent Law." For the most recent completed fiscal year, 2015-2016. SBCCD expended \$39,308,396 (50.19%) on instructional salaries, which was \$144,926 over the 50% requirement. SBCCD's total expense of education was \$78,326,941. Faculty positions and assignments that do not count as classroom instructors include Librarians, Counselors, Instructional Deans, faculty Directors (EOPS, Athletic, Transfer Center), and faculty reassigned time. Other instructional expenses that cannot count include computer lab equipment and staff, instructional computers, students support services, and distance education support.
