According to the <u>CCCCO</u>, under the new regulations, students would lose eligibility for the BOG if they were on probation for not maintaining a 2.0 GPA for two consecutive primary terms or not successfully completing half the units attempted in that period. The requirement is based on <u>SB-1456</u>. <u>Colleges</u> have defined the requirement as the following: students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher **and** have a cumulative successful course completion rate of more than 50% of all coursework attempted. I defined the latter as students who completed 50% of their course work within the Fall 2015 semester.

The table below illustrates the number of unduplicated BOG recipients district wide for Fall 2015 (n = 13,276). In addition, the number and percent of BOG recipients who would have met (n = 11,367,86%) and not met (n = 1,909,14%) the new requirements are also shown below.
