#### **Ongoing Program & Service Delivery:**

- Training was provided in our ongoing contracts/grants as evidenced in the attached training summary for July. A total of 768 participants (duplicated count) attended class and over 6,000 instructional hours were provided.
- Source of funding for the training provided was the Employment Training Panel (ETP), Trade Adjustment Act (TAA), State Chancellor's Office (Industry Driven Regional Collaborative, IDRC) and the Goodwill of Southern California.
- In addition, 230 parolees (duplicated count) participated in an 8-hour shift performing litter abatement as part of our California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) transitional work program.

#### **In Progress:**

- *San Bernardino County Probation Department* – Professional & Workforce Development is seeking a small contract from SB County probation to offer 1 cohort of training in Industrial Maintenance Mechanic as a beta test to securing a larger contract.
- *\$200M Strong Workforce* – EDCT is positioning Contract Education delivered by Professional & Workforce Development as the vehicle to develop training agreements consistent with the 40% dollars and the still undeveloped regional plan.
- *San Bernardino County Economic Development Agency/Workforce Development Division* – Development of an unsolicited project is in progress for incumbent workers employed at the California Board of Equalization to be funded under WIOA.
- *Regional SlingShot Initiative* - EDCT SlingShot grant application jointly released by Riverside and San Bernardino Counties, Workforce Development Boards. This would identify us as priority vendors for any subsequent dollars funded through this initiative.

### ICreate Program:

Met with the Jane Goodall Foundation board members, was very productive and we are moving forward with a collaborative effort between the Jane Goodall Foundation, Region 10 After School Region, SBCUSD and SBCSS (possibly the Global STEM Leadership Alliance, University of Redlands and ESRI) for a Roots and Shoots pilot program this academic year for K-16 students. The focus will be on "How to make a Difference" and will be included in a Curiosity Quest Problem Solver episode(s). This will be a sub program of the ICreate program. The current scheduling for the ICreate annual program is underway.

### SeaPerch Program:

Held at the CSUSB campus and partnering with Arrowhead United Way, SBCCD taught 40+ students about STEM while building SeaPerch units (underwater Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV)).

### Summer School Programming:

Provided mechanical engineering activities for CAPS participants at the San Bernardino Boys and Girls Club. Provided robotics and manufacturing programs for the month of June to the After School Summer School students through the SBCUSD.

### STEM Night

SeaPerch Demonstration in Lake Elsinore in collaboration with UCR and SBCSS – Kids and adults of all ages played with the SeaPerch units and were given the chance to win a SeaPerch unit to build at home.

### Curiosity Quest Problem Solvers:

In partnership with Small Business DSN the episode has been filmed, edited, and will be ready to share in the next few weeks. In partnership with the Advanced Transportation and Renewables DSN we are in the process of filming a community college video regarding our automotive programs. The CQPS Anti Bullying program launched today, August 9th, in the Etiwanda School District and the Yucaipa Calimesa Joint Unified School District will launch in September. Both are year-long programs where we will measure the effect of the programs on the school culture.

### Grant Projects in Progress:

- **I3 Grant:** Meeting with SBCUSD as a partner on the I3 Grant to discuss the viability of applying. Invitation has been extended to submit.
- **UNESCO Funding:** Working with a variety of partners to develop an International proposal to benefit US-African K-20 students.
- **RAMP UP grant:** Working with SBCUSD we are scheduling alignment meetings with CHC and SBVC and will be working on additional articulation agreements, dual enrollment and Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSO's).
- **DSN Mini Grant:** Funding has been secured and CHC will provide a Classroom to Career CTE session for the San Geronio Girl Scouts.

### Certificates for Educators:

- Teachers, administrators and staff from SBCUSD and Perris School Districts will make up four classes of the STEM Certificate for Educators beginning in September. A collaboration between CSUSB and SBCCD

- The Makers Certificate for Teachers, a partnership with SBVC, SBCSS and CSUSB, is moving forward as well.
- Funding for the Personal Care Aid online course has been secured and the filming should begin in September.
- The Waste Management certificate is still in process.

#### **Summer School Programming at CHC and SBVC:**

- Funding was secured to provide a 2-week boot camp for high school students wishing to pursue a career as an EMT, Paramedic or other health related field.
- 30 high school pathway students enrolled in welding and CAD classes this summer at SBVC with some students now enrolling in night classes.
- Collaboration with SBCUSD will bring more students to SBVC. SBCUSD's goal is to have 2 college classes per site by the end of the academic year.

#### **Ongoing Projects:**

- *Mayor's Business Roundtable Meetings:* Invited to participate in ongoing planning meetings regarding business attraction and economic development in the City of San Bernardino.
- *City of San Bernardino Workforce Development:* Invited by the City Manager's Office to coordinate with SB Police Chief Burguan and SBVC Dean Johnson/Director Klug to discuss programs at Valley College and upcoming new hires for the City of San Bernardino Police Department.
- *Kauffman Foundation 1 Million Cups Initiative:* EDCT Foundation awarded competitive designation to host small business entrepreneurship activities supported by the nationally renowned Kauffman Foundation and its Entrepreneurship Success Initiatives. - *Holiday Celebration:* Planning initiated for Annual Recognition Breakfast to demonstrate appreciation for our business partners with a *Chancellor's Award for Workforce Excellence*.
- *Program Review:* EDCT Foundation strategic planning for FY2016-2017 initiated July 2016.

#### **Grants & Resource Development Initiatives:**

- *Makerspace:* US Green Building Council: \$30,000 grant award in process for development of Inland Empire Makerspace. Fund award pending Los Angeles Chapter Board of Directors site visit September 2016.
- *Makerspace:* Initiated and coordinated SBCCD participation in CCCCO InnovationMaker3 Grant process and regional meeting participation for SBVC and CHC. Solicited faculty involvement with Department Chairs of Computers & Information Technology, and attended San Diego regional partnership meeting hosted by CCCCO in June 2016. SBCCD is now certified as "qualified to apply" for Makerspace funding for each college amounting to between \$250,000-\$450,000, with RFP process expected 8/2016.
- *Entrepreneurship:* City of San Bernardino Economic Development Department: Planning and negotiating development of entrepreneurship program to be delivered by the EDCT Entrepreneurship Institute and funded by the City Community Development Block Grant (projected budget of \$70,000, October 2016) for small business startup services targeting residents of economically depressed wards of the city, and illegal vendors cited by the San Bernardino Police Department. Illegal vendors to be assisted in transitioning to legitimate and licensed businesses.
- *Gang Reduction, Intervention & Prevention:* Invited to coordinate meetings with San Bernardino Police Chief Burguan with EDCT to discuss grant partnerships with CSU San Bernardino to establish gang interdiction programs centered on workforce development.
- *Retail, Hospitality, Tourism Sector Navigator Grant:* \$10,000 to create a noncredit Hospitality Skills Certificate for Valley College to feed into their credit Culinary Arts programs, and a noncredit Retail Skills Certificate at Crafton Hills College to feed into their

credit Retail Management Certificate. Grant application to be submitted in partnership with and on behalf of each college 8/2016.

- *Kauffman Inclusion Grant*: Special Invitation presented to EDCT Foundation to apply for funding for innovative entrepreneurship education and training models to address minority business startup needs. Amount to be determined. Due 9/1/2016.
- *Pre-Apprenticeship Grant*: Energy, Construction, and Utilities Sector Navigator Grant for development of “Specialty Trades Component” of the SBCCD Multi-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3) Pre-Apprenticeship Program. Specialty Trades Component focus will be developed in partnership with the Riverside & San Bernardino Counties Building & Construction Trades Council, with specialization curriculum centered on Energy Efficiency-HVACR Sheet Metal/Electrical/Pipe Trades, Solar-Electrical Trades, and Water Conservation-Pipe Trades. Application to be submitted 8/2016.
- *Business Workshops*: Monthly breakfast workshops designed around progressive topics useful to small businesses, including social media, effective marketing strategies, customer service management, etc. Currently in planning phase, with survey phase slated for September 2016 in partnership with the MicroEnterprise Collaborative of Inland Southern California.
- *CEO Club*: Annual membership of regional CEOs to include quarterly luncheons with the Chancellor featuring renowned speakers as part of a Speaker’s Series/Book Signings. Objective is cultivation of long-term relationships with business and industry leaders, engagement of their businesses with EDCT programs and services, and ultimately, increased opportunities for fundraising objectives. Will involve \$1,000 membership fee/donation to EDCT Foundation.
- *Chancellor’s Circle of Champions*: Development of the Chancellor’s Advisory Council consisting of business, industry and community leaders with a vested interest in higher education and workforce, business, community and economic development. Bi-Monthly advisory council breakfast meetings hosted by the EDCT Foundation, with facilitated discussions on priority topics to inform the Chancellor on development of priority education and development initiatives. \$1,500 membership fee/donation to EDCT Foundation, with CEO Club membership applicable towards this fee for interested CEO Club members.
