Identity Theft Scams

WHAT IS PHISHING?

Phishing (pronounced “fishing”) is a
computer scam criminals use to
trick persons using the Internet to
disclose vital financial and personal
information such as Social Security
numbers, account numbers and
passwords.

WHAT IS PHARMING?

Pharming (pronounced “farming”) is
the latest cyberswindle which threat-
ens to harvest entire fields of vic-
tims. Pharmers redirect Internet us-
ers from legitimate commercial web-
sites to counterfeit web pages to
trick them to disclose their vital fi-
nancial and personal information.
