IRS Phone Scam

The IRS renewed its October 2013 warning about a pervasive phone scam that continues to target people across the nation. The Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration called it the largest scam of its kind. As of March 20, TIGTA reported that it has received reports of over 20,000 contacts related to this scam. TIGTA also stated that thousands of victims have paid over \$1 million to fraudsters claiming to be from the IRS.

In this scam, the thief poses as the IRS and makes unsolicited calls to their target(s). The caller tells the victim they owe taxes to the IRS. They demand that the victim pay the money immediately with a preloaded debit or wire transfer. The caller often threatens the victim with arrest, deportation or suspensions of a business or driver's license. In many cases the caller becomes hostile and insulting.

Thieves who run this scam often:

- Use common names and fake IRS badge numbers.
- Know the last four digits of the victim's Social Security Number.
- Send bogus IRS e-mails to support the bogus calls.
- Call a second time claiming to be the police or DMV.

If you get a call from someone who claims to be with the IRS asking you to pay back taxes, here's what you should do:

- ◆ If you owe, or think you might owe federal taxes, hang up and call the IRS at 800-829-1040. IRS workers can help you with your payment questions.
- ◆ If you don't owe taxes, call and report the incident to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at 800-366-4484

Protect yourself and avoid becoming a victim:

- * Be wary of any unexpected phone or e-mail communication allegedly from the IRS.
- * IRS usually first contacts people by mail - not by phone - about unpaid taxes.
- * IRS won't ask for payment using a preloaded debit card or wire transfer.
- * IRS doesn't initiate contact with taxpayers by e-mail to request personal or financial information.
- * IRS doesn't ask for PINs, passwords or similar confidential information for credit card, bank or other accounts.

The IRS urges you to be vigilant against the many different types of tax scams. Their common goal is to steal your money, an often to steal your identity. Visit genuine IRS website <http://www.irs.gov> for more information on what you should do to avoid becoming a victim.

Emergency Preparedness

This week: Seven Steps to Earthquake Safety: When it comes to earthquake disasters, there are simple things you can do to make yourself safer. Over the next 7 weeks you will find one step in the step-by-step guide to give you details on what to do before, during, and after an earthquake.

STEP 1: Secure your space by identifying hazards and securing moveable items.

START NOW by moving furniture such as bookcases away from beds, sofas, or other places where people sit, sleep, or spend a lot of time. Move heavy objects to lower shelves. Then continue your "hazard hunt" to help identify and fix things such as unsecured televisions, computers, bookcases, furniture, unstrapped water heaters, etc. Why is this important? Several people died and thousands were injured in the 1994 Northridge earthquake because of unsecured items such as toppling bookcases. According to a study from the University of California in Los Angeles (UCLA), 55% of the injuries during this earthquake were caused by falling furniture or objects. Try securing at least one item every weekend until you get everything done!
