BEFORE YOU GO

1 STOP YOUR PHYSICAL MAIL DELIVERY



Request a hold on all of your physical mail from your local Post Office.

2 TURN ON ACCOUNT ALERTS



Contact your financial institution to set up alerts on all of your accounts.

3 LEAVE MOST OF YOUR IDENTITY AT HOME



Leave items like checkbooks, Social Security cards and excess credit and debit cards at home.

4 GET A TRAVEL-ONLY DEBIT CARD



Request a travel-only ATM/debit card with a 4-digit PIN from your bank.

5 DO NOT POST ON SOCIAL MEDIA SITES



Posting your vacation plans on social media sites lets potential robbers know you aren't home.

ON THE ROAD

6 USE RFID-BLOCKING PRODUCTS



RFID-blocking products help protect you from electronic pickpocketing.

7 AVOID USING PUBLIC COMPUTERS



Do not use computers in hotels or cafés as your sensitive data could be recorded and exploited.

8 SECURE THE DATA ON YOUR SMARTPHONE



Enable passcode and remote tracking on your smartphone to keep your data safe from thieves.

9 BE CAUTIOUS WHEN USING AN ATM



Always shield your PIN and don't accept withdrawal help from anyone.

10 LOCK UP PERSONAL DEVICES



Lock digital devices, valuables and travel documents in your hotel room safe when not in use.

BACK AT HOME

11 RESTART YOUR PHYSICAL MAIL DELIVERY



Restart your physical mail and check that no critical statements are missing.

12 REVIEW CREDIT CARD STATEMENTS



Review credit card and bank statements for any fraudulent charges that may have occurred.

13 CONTACT YOUR FINANCIAL INSTITUTION



Contact your financial institution if you notice suspicious activities or missing financial documents.

14 TURN OFF YOUR TRAVEL-ONLY DEBIT CARD



Contact your financial institution to deactivate your travel-only debit card.

15 POST ON SOCIAL MEDIA SITES



Now that you are home, post pictures and share all the fun you had!
