BEWARE OF CLUB DRUGS

In recent years, "club drugs" have become
popular among adolescents and young adults
who frequent nightclubs and all-night parties
called raves. These drugs include MDMA
(ecstasy), LSD, and methamphetamine, among
others. Promoters of club drug use tout the
drugs' reputation for producing psychedelic
and stimulant effects, giving users energy, stamina,
and feelings of euphoria. However, despite
the misconception that club drugs are harmless,
the psychological effects of using these drugs
include hallucination, confusion, depression,
anxiety, and paranoia. Users may experience
physical consequences such as nausea, faintness,
and an increase in heart rate and blood pressure.
Ecstasy use in particular may cause hyper-
thermia, muscle breakdown, seizures, stroke,
kidney and cardiovascular system failure, per-
manent brain damage, and death.

Ecstasy: is an inexpensive stimulant and hallu-
cinogen, most commonly abused by those at-
tending raves or clubs.

GHB: is an anabolic steroid with euphoric and
sedative effects that has been used to facilitate
to date rape.

Ketamine: due to its anesthetic properties, may
be slipped into a persons drink, rendering him
or her unconscious and vulnerable to sexual
assault.

Methamphetamine: are addictive stimulants
that enhance mood and body movement. They
may be abused by clubbers and ravers, and are
moving rapidly into other aspects of student
culture.
