Helping a victim of Rape to Come forward

Build a trust bond between you and the victim. The first thing you should do when you have stumbled upon a victim is to create the trust bond so that you can get them to talk out their feelings. Being that many rape victims generally don't like to talk about what happened to them, establishing trust can be hard to do. While it may be hard, creating trust can be at least attempted by carrying an open mind. Make yourself available to the victim. Now the victim has begun to trust you better, and they will probably want to talk more to you than they will their family or the police. When dealing with a rape victim, all the trust in the world won't do the victim any good if you aren't around to talk when they really need someone to talk to. Not being there for a rape victim when they need someone to talk to can tarnish the trust the person has put into you. You do not have to baby-sit the victim; however, it is recommended that you at least leave your phone number or other contact information with the victim so that they can get in touch with you when they need to talk., open heart and open ears.

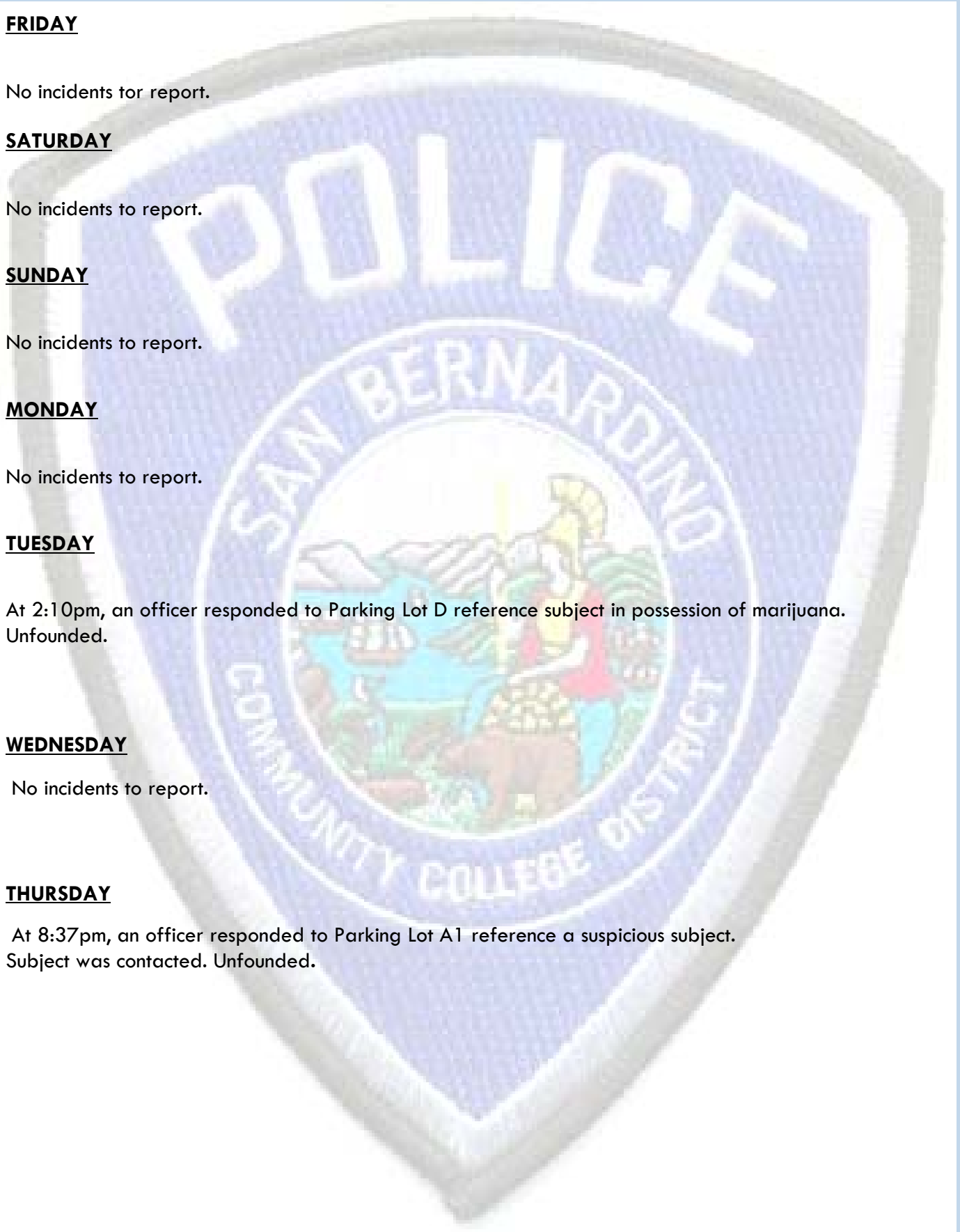

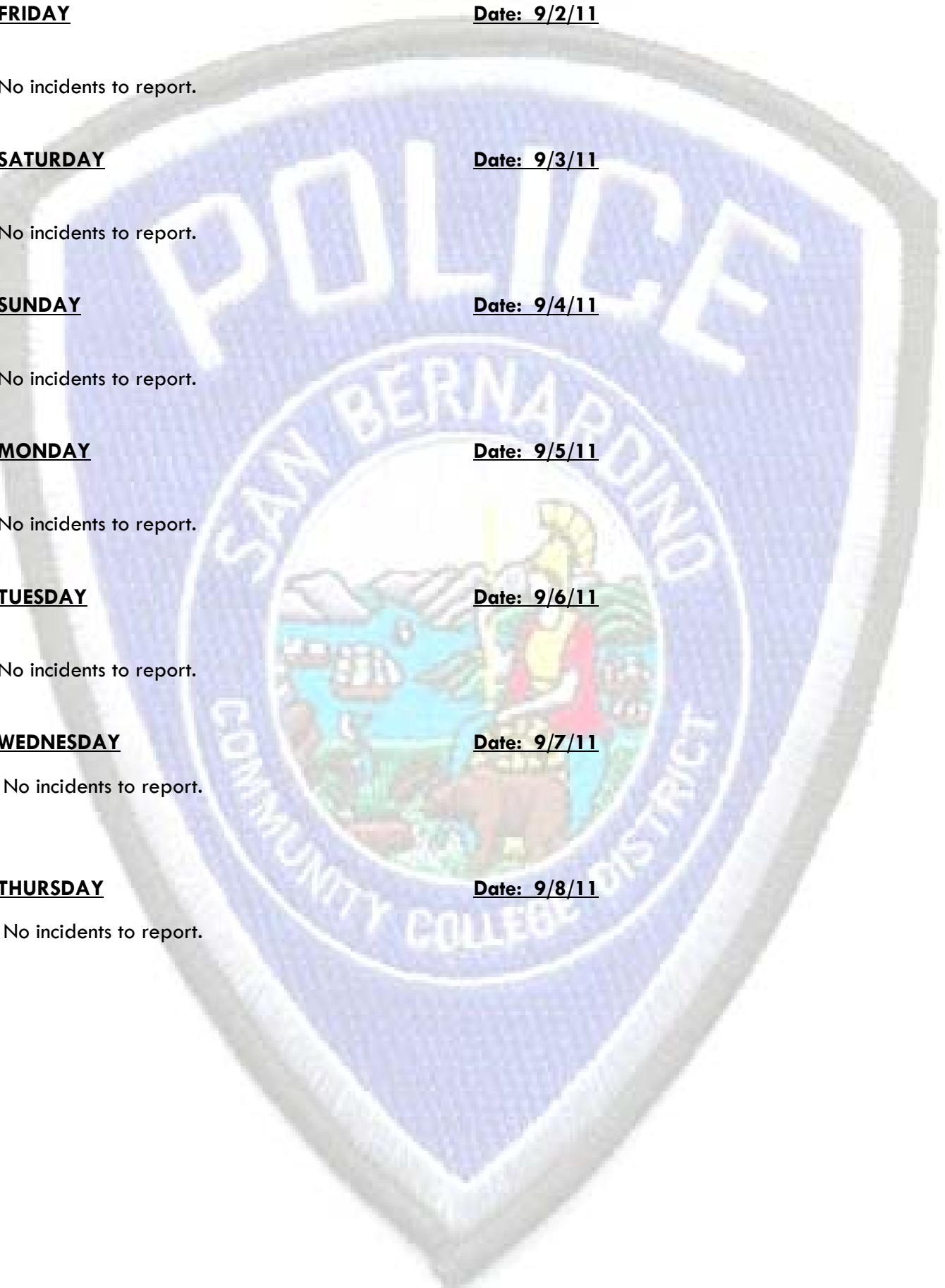
