Fire Prevention and Safety Tips

The biggest disaster threat to families across our nation every day isn't a flood or hurricane; it's fire. On a national basis, the American Red Cross responds to more than 63,000 local fires, on average, each year. However, home fires are the one disaster than can be prevented with proper fire prevention and safety techniques.

That's why the American Red Cross is encouraging people to take steps to minimize the risk of home fires by remembering two key fire safety steps: install a smoke alarm and develop a fire escape plan.

It is recommended that people check each smoke alarm in their home by pushing the test button at least once a month and replace batteries every year, or as needed. Also, replace smoke alarms every ten years. Fire escape plans should include at least two escape routes from every room in the home, and a convenient meeting place at a safe distance from the home. Practice your escape plan at least twice a year and revise as necessary. Families are encouraged to pay particular attention to developing and regularly practicing escape plans for children and older adults.

Simple Steps to Help Prevent Fires

- 1. Keep all sources of fuel (paper, clothing, bedding, and carpets or rugs) at least three feet away from all heat sources when cooking, or using alternative heating like a space heater.
- 2. Don't leave the kitchen while you're frying, grilling or broiling food, and don't leave home if you're simmering, baking, boiling or roasting food.
- 3. Keep matches and lighters away from and out of reach of children.

Safety Tips in the Event that a Fire Strikes Your Home

- 1. Once you are out, stay out! Call the fire department from a neighbor's home.
- 2. If you see smoke or fire in your first escape route, use your second way out. If you must exit through smoke, crawl low under the smoke to your exit. If you are escaping through a closed door, feel the door before opening it. If the door is warm, use your second way out.
- 3. If smoke, heat, or flames block your exit routes, stay in the room with the door closed. Signal for help using a brightly colored cloth at the window. If there is a telephone in the room, call the fire department and tell them where you are.
