## Missing Persons Checklist

As soon as you believe a loved one is missing, call your local law enforcement agency and file a Missing Person report. Having the following information about the Missing Person available will greatly assist law enforcement in their investigation:

1. Recent photograph of the Missing Person (Have a duplicate ready because the photograph will be retained by the responding officer)
2. Drivers License Number
3. Social Security Number
4. Their current business address and phone number
5. Cell Phone Number
6. Description of their last known clothing / attire; inclusive of any jewelry they were wearing
7. The last known location and possible destination of the Missing Person
8. Their doctor's and or dentist's contact information
9. Vehicle information (Make, Model, Year, Color, License Plate #, any identifiable marking(s) on vehicle)
10. Contact information for any known friends / coworkers they usually associate with

**What to Expect After Filing a Missing Person Report:**

You will be issued a case number which you need to hold on to for future reference. After that, typically your report will be immediately entered into a Nation Wide data system. Barring any unusual circumstances (possible abduction, severe mental health issues, suspicious circumstances, young child) the responding officer will generally do an area check for the Missing Person at locations they are said to frequent. If the person is not located a Be On the Look Out or "BOLO" is usually issued city or county wide. Your report will later be assigned to a detective / investigator for follow up.

**What You Can Do After Filing a Report:**

Unfortunately, because of the nationwide epidemic of low staffing levels for law enforcement agencies, active leg work on a missing person by a department can sometimes be extended. This does not mean you cannot start looking or reaching out to others for help. Social Media, such as Facebook and Twitter, are great resources to get the word out if someone goes missing. Check with the loved one's cell phone provider to see if his or her phone is GPS enabled. If it is, forward this information to the police. Further, it never hurts to get together with family and friends and start Actively Looking yourself.

**If the Person Returns:**

If the missing person returns prior to being located by police, immediately notify the original agency that took the report. They will need to come back out and do another report, which is called a "Locate" report, in order to take your loved one out of the Nation Wide data system. It is important that this happens because in the event your loved one is later contacted by police, even for a simple traffic violation, his detention will be extended because his status will still come up as "Missing" through police records. He or she will remain detained until the officer can determine they are no longer classified as "Missing."
