THE DANGERS OF CONSUMING MARIJUANA EDIBLES

The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department issued an advisory on recent incidents of individuals consuming food items believed to contain marijuana. Marijuana Edibles

Many people underestimate the potency of edibles made with marijuana. Here are some facts:

- Today's high-grade marijuana contains an average Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) level of 12-23% (compared to 2-4% in the 70's and 80's). THC is the main ingredient that causes the "high" when consumed by users and is considered as a highly hallucinogenic compound.
- Pot edibles can be exponentially more potent than a joint because of the high THC concentration.
- A baked-goody can contain 100mg of THC or 10 servings. Marijuana edible products should not be consumed at once because they are of multiple servings in one item.
- Edibles have a delayed absorption rate, making it more dangerous as a person consumes more without feeling an abrupt side effect of the drug. It can take 2-4 hours to begin feeling the effects of ingesting too much marijuana.
- Symptoms include: temporary feelings of paranoia, fear and anxiety, shortness of breath, fast heart rate, uncontrollable shaking, feeling cold, vomiting and/or nausea. Severe cases may include disorientation or hallucination, and in some cases, of dangerous complications and side effects.

Reported Incidents

Children and adults alike have reported ill-effects of consuming edible marijuana. Some of the reported incidents:

- A 3-yr. old girl ingested some "canna-butter" (marijuana infused butter) and was reported lying on the couch, seemed tired and not acting normal. Parents were charged with child abuse.
- A college student eats more than the recommended dose of a marijuana-laced cookie and afterwards jumps out from a hotel lobby and died.
- Husband with no history of violence was accused of shooting his wife in the head, possibly after eating pot-infused candy.
- A casual marijuana smoker tried the edible product trying to curb his anxiety and insomnia. Eighty minutes into his experiment, he got intensely sick and lost control of his body. By 90 minutes, he was hyperventilating, freaking out and heading to the emergency room seeking medical attention.

Regulations and Health Concerns

The United States Food and Drug Administration (the regulatory agency for food products) does not have a mechanism in place for inspection and regulation of the facilities where marijuana edibles are made. As a Schedule 1 Classified Drug, marijuana and its edible form are not subject to federal regulations and safety testing either. California law does not require manufacturers of marijuana edibles to test THC contents in them. Most are manufactured and packaged in the form of sweets, cookies, cakes, candies, and the likes, resembling grocery products that are indistinguishable to children and adults.

SBCCD recommends to avoid the use of marijuana edibles produced by unlicensed and unregulated manufacturers. In various investigations, the Sheriff's Narcotics have discovered doctors and physicians providing medical prescriptions of medical marijuana with limited patient examination, and an absence of recommended dosage for its use; making it susceptible for the drug misuse and abuse.
