### College Students: Targets for Cyber Theft

College students may present the perfect storm for identity theft. They are vulnerable on their computers, smartphones and tablets. They are vulnerable in their dorm rooms, their mail and personal papers and they are vulnerable on the myriad of social media they use.

College students and major users of smartphones. Take a look at any college campus between classes you will see their smartphones pressed to their ears as they walk to their next class. College students live their lives on their smartphones with apps for everything, but too many of them fail to take the necessary security to protect the data on their smartphones. Everyone, including college students should take the follow steps:



1. Use a strong password to secure the phone
2. Set it up to lock automatically when not in use. This helps protect the smart phone if it was ever lost or stolen.
3. Install the latest anti-malware and anti-virus software and keep the software updated with the latest security patches.
4. Only download apps from legitimate sources, such as the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store
5. Use encryption software to protect the information stored on your smartphone
6. Turn off Bluetooth and NFC when not using them to prevent surreptitious access to the device

College students are avid users of social media and many do so without taking the necessary precautions to protect themselves from identity theft. College students should take these steps to enhance their security.

1. Adjust the privacy setting on their social media sites in order to make it more difficult for people they don't know to view information or post material in their page.
2. Understand the privacy policies of the social networking sites used and with whom they share information
3. Just as you shouldn't click on links or download attachments from text messages, you should avoid doing so in response to messages that you receive through social media. Even if it appears that the message comes from someone you know and trust, their account may have been hijacked.
