Black History in Law Enforcement



As we celebrate Black History Month here in the U.S., it seems like a good time to reflect on black history in law enforcement.

Numerous resources recognize Wiley Overton as the first black police officer in the United States. Officer Overton was sworn in at the Brooklyn Police Department (now part of the New York City Police Department) on March 6, 1891. However, in 2008, a police archivist uncovered information revealing an even earlier "first." Sergeant Horatio Homer was the first black officer hired by the Boston, Massachusetts, Police Department on Christmas Eve in 1878. Sergeant Homer went on to serve with the department for over four decades.

Today, law enforcement agencies are much more diverse. According to the Bureau of Justice Statistics, in 2007, there were approximately 55,267 black officers employed by local police departments; a 5% increase from just four years prior. Many agencies strive for diversity, with more and more agencies conducting targeted recruitment campaigns for women and minorities.
