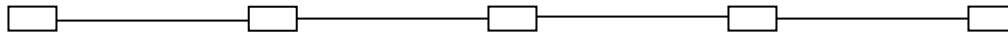

The program provides training in all facets of construction, based on the California Code of Regulations Title 24 of the State building code. The curriculum includes the use of the structural, mechanical, plumbing, electrical, and HVAC codes. It also covers testing of construction materials such as soil, asphalt, concrete, masonry, wood, steel, non-structural plan review, and related laws. It takes two years to complete the certification program as only 3 courses are offered per semester.

Diversity-The program is not a very diverse program. We would like to hire a minority female faculty which would by its very nature promote more minority interest.

Grants- The grant to date that the Inspection Technology Department could be a part of is the Perkins IV grant but is not presently.
