1. Purpose of this Program - Meets

Efficacy Team Analysis and Feedback: Program reports no change in purpose or target student population. The program prepares students for jobs as library paraprofessionals or support staff.

2. Demand for this Program - Meets

Efficacy Team Analysis and Feedback: The program reports 12% growth based on BLS outlook. Federal education laws require the completion of a certificate or degree in Library Technology in order to meet qualifications to work in local school districts.

3. Quality of this Program - Meets

Efficacy Team Analysis and Feedback: The program reports curriculum changes to maintain current library practice and changes to scheduling of courses.

4. External Issues - Meets
