Students taking courses in Political Science in general, and especially those who take the Honors Introduction course in World Politics or Introduction to Comparative Politics, are likely to view a MUN club an enriching experience.
	Our students can become SBVC delegates to MUN conferences held in other colleges where competitions take place and prizes are awarded. At least at the beginning, such delegates, about 4 in all plus their faculty advisor, will be sponsored by the club. Costs of travel, hotel, shuttle, and meals will be included. This is designed, in part, to stimulate a keen competition and arouse more than passing interest among members of the club.

5. What are the consequences of not funding this budget request?

To not fund this project will mean that SBVC will remain one of the few colleges in the area that cannot boast of a MUN. It will also mean that an important reason for hiring a full-time faculty in 2013 to teach World Politics and Comparative Politics is not being advanced.
