The Student Success Center requests four adjunct, faculty members due to increased course offerings, the continuation of increased student demand for academic support, and the need for student hourly academic support staff to be supported by faculty content experts. While there is not currently any data to support the request, program staff have noticed through student staff interaction and interaction with students who receive services within the SSC that student tutors require assistance from faculty to ensure that the academic services which are provided remain at a high academic standard through continued training, support, and mentorship.

Data from the last EMP shows significant improvements to student success and retention for students who attend tutoring within the Student Success Center. 3. Provide updated or additional information you wish the committee to consider (*for example, regulatory information, compliance, updated efficiency, student success data, planning, etc.*).

The Student Success Center Staff have witnessed the need for faculty support of the student academic tutors. Student tutors at times may not remain sharp on their content skills. Assessments have been developed to periodically assess tutor staff as to content competency. Faculty are needed to provide training and content support for student tutor staff to ensure that SBVC students receive a high level of academic support. Furthermore, faculty presence is a key component in order to receive positive attendance FTES funding from the State for students who are currently attending the Student Success Center for academic support. Many local community colleges have had faculty be a component in academic support centers for years in order to provide content expertise and allow for FTES collection.

4. What are the consequences of not filling this position?

SBVC will continue to not be able to collect on a funding stream for work which is already being performed and student tutors will not be supported in their effort to provide the highest level of academic support to SBVC students.
