Replacement Growth

1. Renovation Request

Additional fluorescent lighting in rooms Art 107 and Art 114, the drawing and painting areas of the Art Department. There is inadequate light in both rooms for drawing and painting classes, especially near the north walls of the rooms. The inadequate lighting affects safety, task performance, visual comfort, and aesthetic judgment for the students.

Approximate Cost: \$7,824.00

2. Renovation Request

Under cabinet lighting and additional fluorescent lighting in the ceramics and sculpture areas, rooms Art 129 and Art 131. There is inadequate light in both areas for the ceramic and sculpture students. The inadequate lighting may affect safety, task performance, visual comfort, and aesthetic judgment for the students.

Approximate Cost: \$2,213.00

3. Renovation Request

Room darkening window shades in the drawing (Art 107) and painting (Art 114) rooms to provide an acceptable image from the LCD projectors. Currently the images are so light it is difficult for the students to view the projected materials.

Approximate Cost: \$300.00
