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What is CalWORKs?



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ent(s) who receive public assistance must meet activity (educational, employment, etc.) requirements. The CalWORKs Office can assist with educational and employment support to meet related activity needs.

Who is Eligible?

If you are a current San Bernardino Valley College (SBVC) student receiving public assistance for yourself and your child(ren), you are eligible to receive supportive services from the Cal-WORKs Department.

Eligibility Requirements

- Current Notice of Action or County income verification form
- Current Welfare-to-Work contract or exemption form
- Current SBVC class schedule



The **EOPS** Program staff is committed to the success of the students in the program. Students are provided with a number of activities that have been proven effective in helping students work towards a successful educational experience. EOPS services are available to people who seek higher education but demonstrate financial need and require extra assistance to succeed.

To be eligible, a student must:

- Be a California resident or qualified AB540
- Be enrolled as a full-time student (12 units) at time of acceptance
- Earned less than 70 degree applicable unit (from all colleges attended)
- Qualify to receive a California College Promise Program Grant Fee Waiver A or B (formerly BOG A or B)
- Demonstrate an educational disadvantaged as defined by EOPS
- Attend EOPS mandatory orientation once determined eligible

The CARE Program offers additional support services to EOPS students who are also single-parents receiving TANF/ CalWORKs benefits to support their family. The goal of the CARE Program is to break the welfare-dependency cycle by supporting students in completing collegelevel educational training programs, and therefore, becoming more employable and economically self-sufficient.



To be eligible, a student must:

- Be 18 years or older
- Be single head of household
- Be a current recipient of TANF/CalWORKs
- Be enrolled as a full-time student upon admission into the program
- Be an active/current EOPS student

To become a CARE student:

- Apply and be eligible for EOPS
- Apply for CARE Program
- Submit proof of TANF/CalWORKs participation
- Attend mandatory CARE orientation

Qualify for Service

Eligibility

To be eligible for services, an individual must:

- Have a physical or mental impairment.
- Substantially impedes his or her ability to secure employment.
- Vocational rehabilitation services are required to prepare for, secure, retain, or regain employment consistent with the applicant's unique strengths, resources, priorities, concerns, abilities, capabilities, interests.
- The individual can benefit from the provision of services in terms of an employment outcome in an integrated setting.


Program participants are expected to be available, responsible, active and dedicated contributors to their own success.





Have a Higher Quality of Life

- Be Employed: with training and support, an individual with a disability can access a wealth of opportunities to fully participate in and contribute to their community.
- Be Independent: with selfdetermination, equal access to a range of options, and a personal commitment to pursue them; one can choose how to live one's life.
