

- Intensive/Full-Time
- Extended/Part-Time

The state screening requirements for admission into any of the Basic Law Enforcement Academies are:

- A valid California Driver's License with no restrictions
- Department of Justice/Federal Bureau of Investigation/Firearms fingerprint check and Elearance

• A medical release from a physician

Students working for certificates must have a basic knowledge of math, reading and writing in order to learn and work in the occupations they select.
