

Teaming up with SB Mayor to boost local, global business-education partnerships

SBCCD signed a ceremonial "Declaration of Innovative Collaboration" with Creative Young Community, a Chinese government-sponsored business accelerator with a goal to build 30 incubators in 30 cities throughout China by 2018. San Bernardino Mayor Carey Davis, SBCCD Chancellor Bruce Baron and the SBCCD Board of Trustees welcomed the business delegation on April 27 at the Norton Regional Event Center, adjacent to the San Bernardino International Airport. The declaration of innovative collaboration is an initiative of SBCCD's [Economic Development & Corporate Training Foundation](#) as the first of many future conversations with Creative Young Community to explore business-education partnerships to help local and international entrepreneurs grow their business and create jobs for young people.



Building civically engaged students: Secretary of State Alex Padilla speaks at KVCR-TV student town hall

California's chief elections officer, Secretary of State Alex Padilla, recently visited the KVCR studio to tape a TV town hall hosted by the Crafton Hills College and San Bernardino Valley College Associated Student Governments. During his visit, Padilla thanked SBCCD for being the first and only community college in the Inland Empire to team up with his office to register people to vote in the 2016 elections. "By working together, now California has a new voter registration record: more than 19.4 million people are on the voting rolls," he said. Padilla urged students to register even if they are not yet old enough to vote. In March, [California launched online pre-registration for 16- and 17-year-olds](#). By doing so, their voter registration is automatically activated once they turn 18. Young adults from the surrounding community, including some from Rialto Unified School District and Middle College High School, made up the all-student audience and engaged in a Q&A session with Secretary Padilla.
