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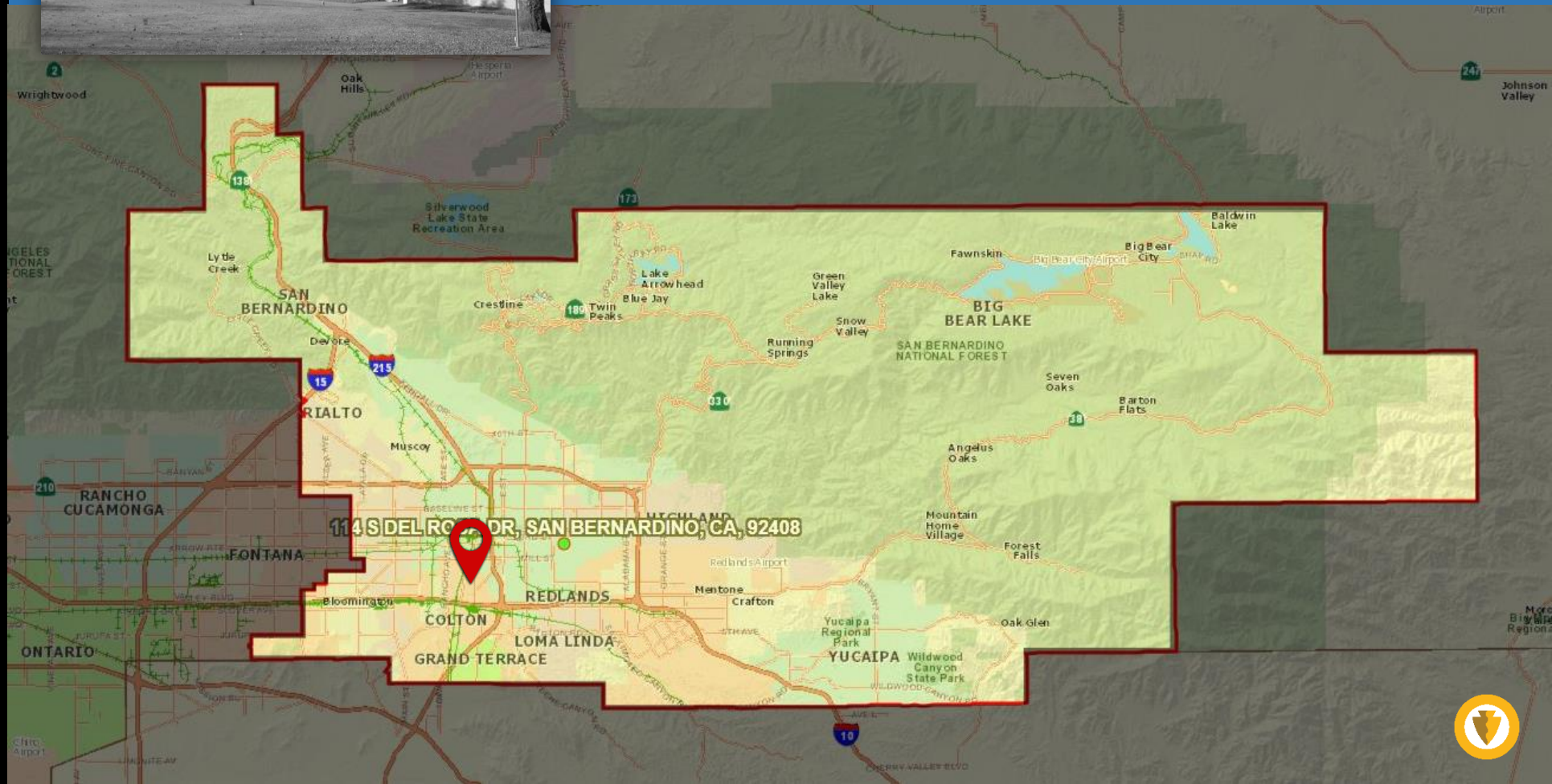

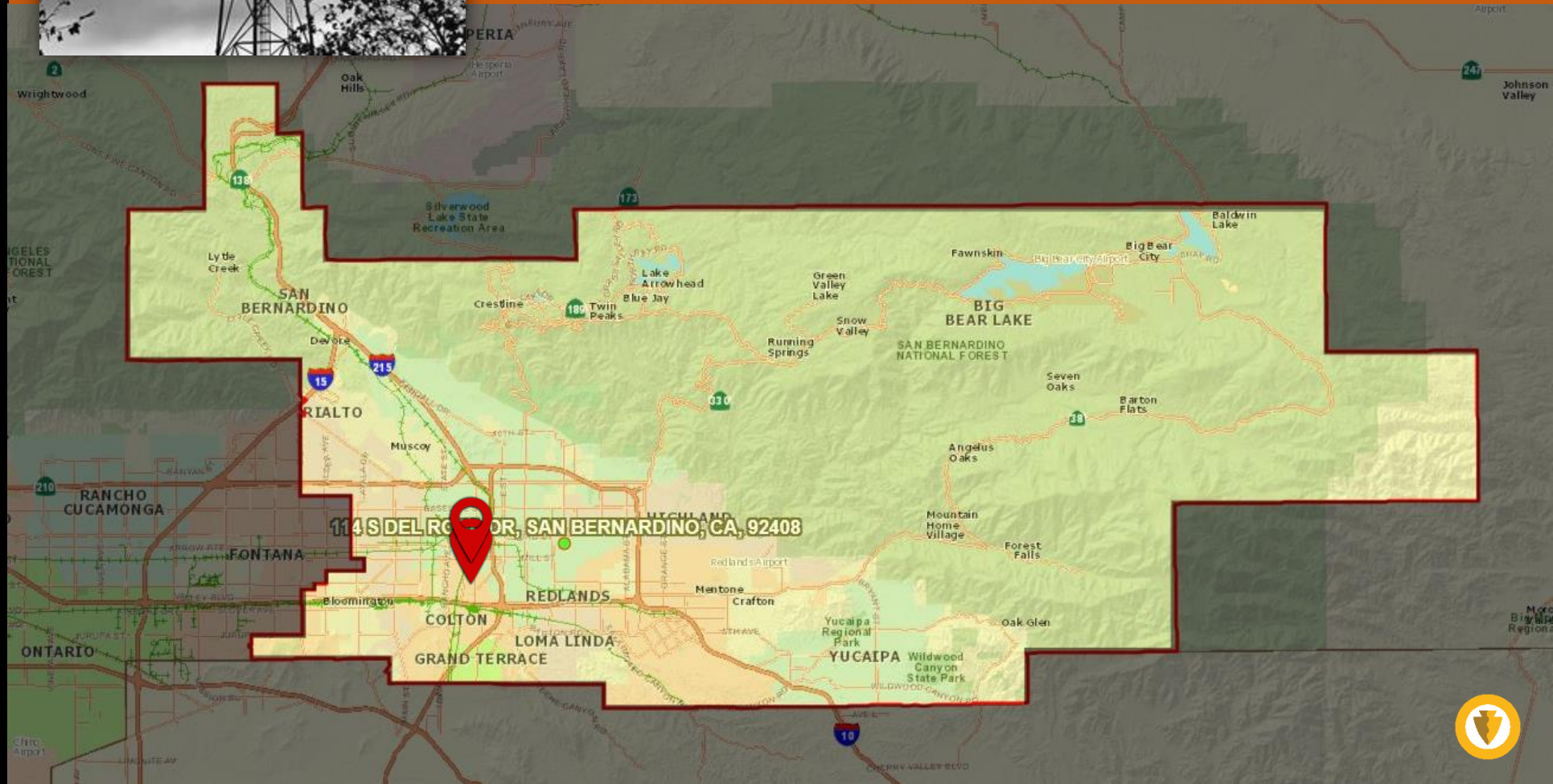

Valley College, Area Schools Pioneer With Educational TV

Area schools, headed by San Bernardino Valley College (VC), are taking their first firm steps this year into the largely unexplored land of educational tv. VC's educational tv station — KVCR-TV — expects to begin broadcasting programs on a regular basis Sept. 11, according to Robert Fuzy, who heads VC's new Division of Telecommunications.

The station will operate on ultra high frequency channel 24. VC officials say the station will cover an area in which schools serving more than 100,000 students are located.

Fuzy said that present plans for the first year call for one five 45-minute program three days a week and the remainder of the programs on tape or film. The live program will be a course in college history.

stalling equipment in anticipation of the start of programming by the VC station.

San Bernardino City Schools have already purchased 50 television receivers with \$5,000 in federal funds received under the National Defense Education Act and matched by local money.

The tv receivers are designed for elementary classrooms, according to Dr. V. V. Kniseley, assistant superintendent for instruction.

Until the VC station begins programming courses for elementary students, the receivers will be utilized to bring to the classroom a regular program of instruction broadcast over channel 11 in Los Angeles.

Dr. Kniseley said the VC station "may have a program for us by mid-semester."

Some of the ways the VC ed-

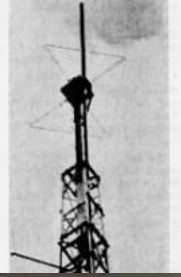
been used in Fontana to observe classroom teaching and methods and materials.

"Educational tv has much potential as a tool," Dr. Kniseley noted. "It won't take the place of the teacher, and it won't save a lot of money. But it has possibilities that we do not want to ignore as far as instruction is concerned."

Dr. Kniseley said he hopes eventually to program a tv course in a foreign language for sixth graders. Recent enactment of legislation by the California Legislature makes teaching of a foreign language mandatory in grades 6, 7 and 8.

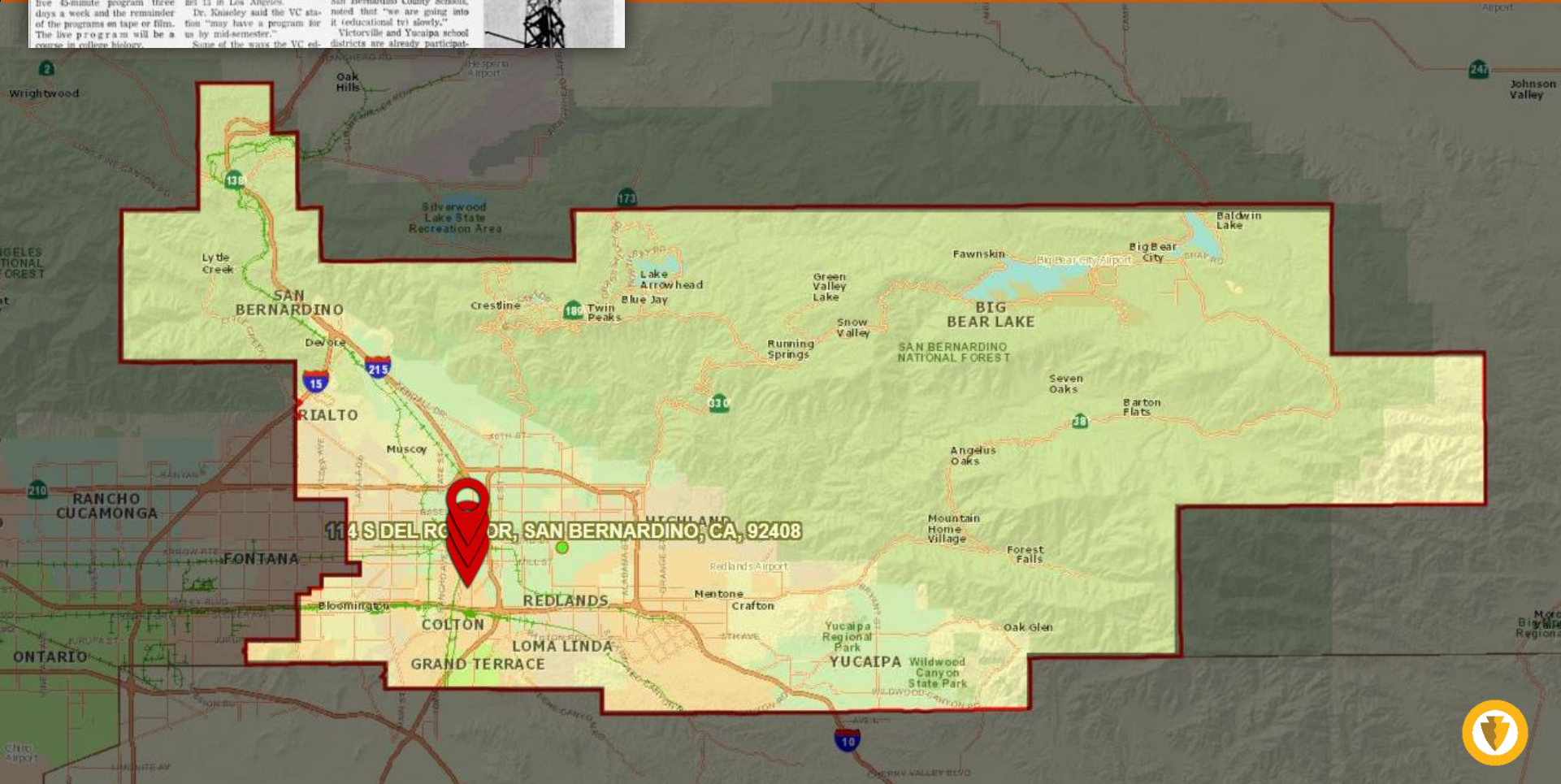
Roy C. Hill, superintendent of San Bernardino County Schools, noted that "we are going into it (educational tv) slowly." Victorville and Yucaipa school districts are already participating.

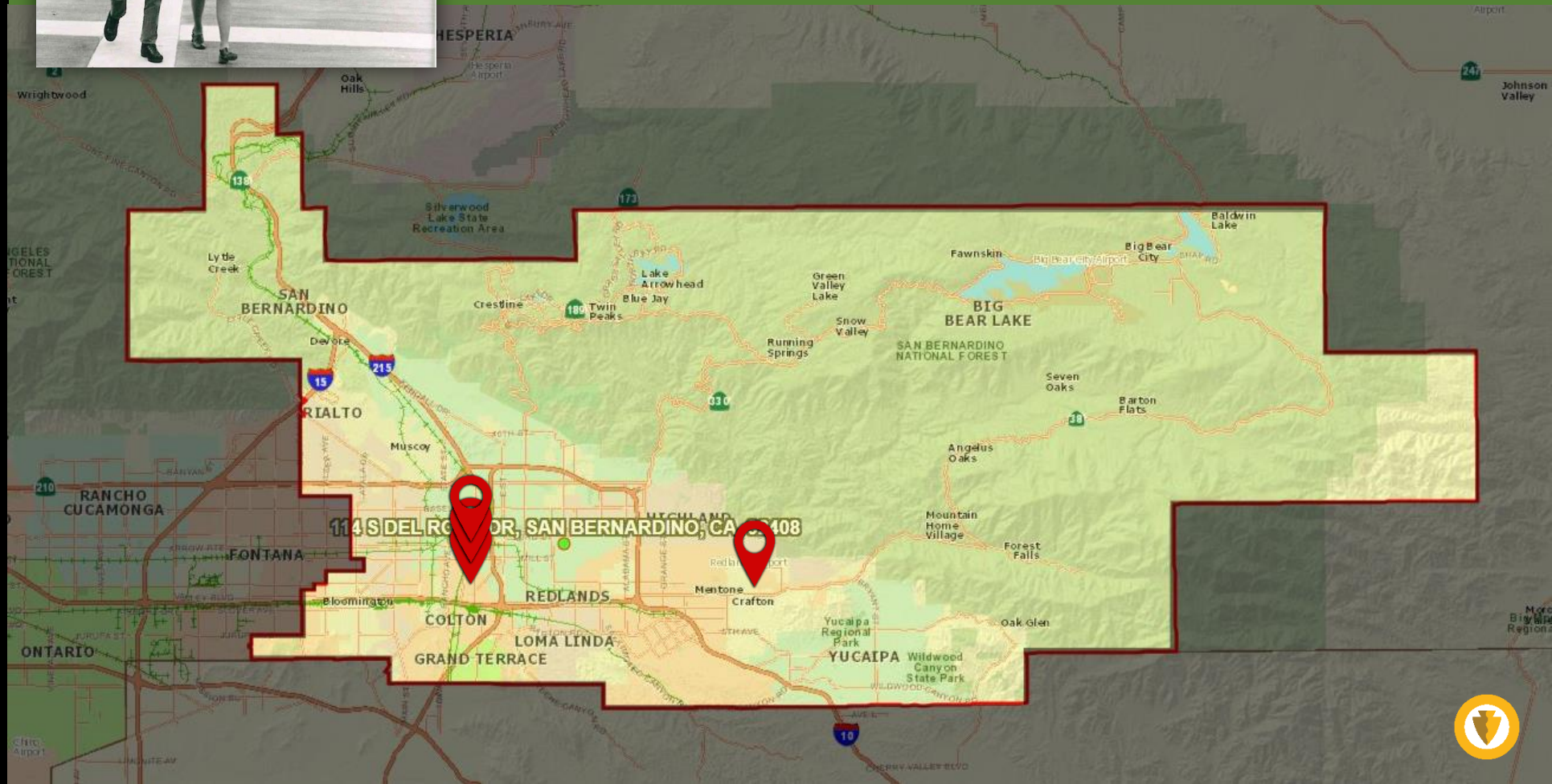



- **Selling Measure CC bonds** based on cash flow



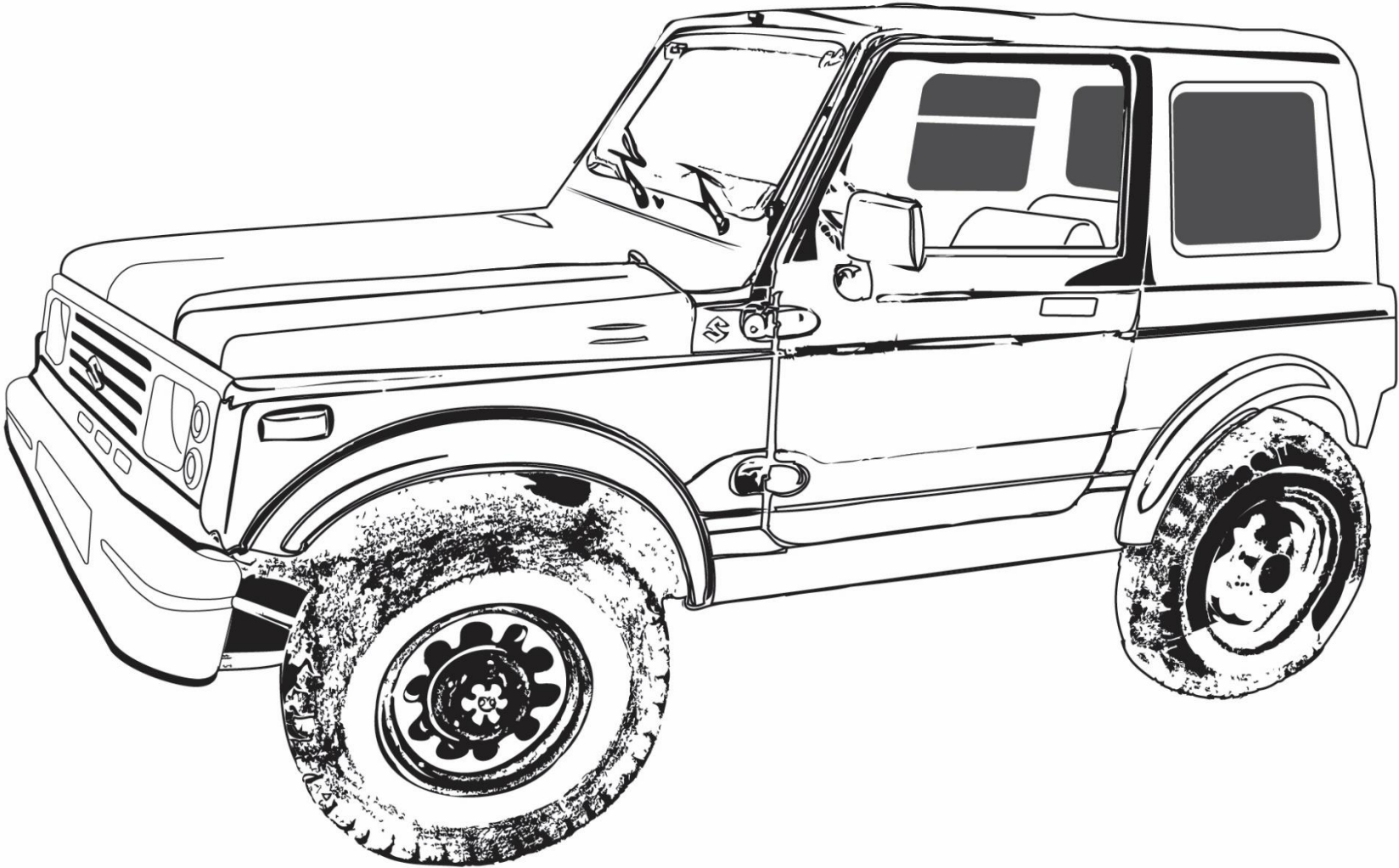
