ABOUT SBCCD

We serve 27,000 students through Crafton Hills College and San Bernardino Valley College and inspire learners of all ages through Empire KVCR, the PBS and NPR affiliate station for the Inland Empire. For nearly 100 years, we have provided access to affordable, award-winning higher education and career training programs. Our service area includes 22 cities and towns within San Bernardino County, the largest county in the contiguous United States.

We are committed to the social and economic mobility of our region, commonly referred to as the Inland Empire. We promote equitable access and completion through broad community partnerships. We have an intentional and collaborative strategic focus on program quality through such initiatives as Vision for Student Success, Guided Pathways, and The Free College Promise. - 1. A letter of application, not to exceed five (5) pages, that succinctly addresses the opportunities and challenges identified in the Position Profile and demonstrates how the candidate's experience and professional qualifications prepare them to serve as the Chancellor of San Bernardino Community College District.
- 2. A current resume including an email address and cellular telephone number.
- 3. A list of eight references. Example: two to three supervisors, two to three direct reports and two to three faculty and/or staff members from current and former institutions.
