Cal Grant 2005-2006

To apply for a Competitive Community College Cal Grant B award, you must do the following by *September 2, 2005*:

- This Competitive Cal Grant is available only to 2005-2006 community college students. You are not eligible if you will not be attending a community college in Fall 2005.
- Determine which of the categories listed below describes you.
- If not done already, complete and have postmarked by September 2, 2005 a 2005-2006 FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA). Make sure San Bernardino Valley College is listed as a school to receive your information!
- If you will complete <u>24 or more</u> college units at San Bernardino Valley College before September 2, 2005, your Valley College Grade Point Average will automatically be reported to the California Student Aid Commission. **Grades before 1981 and units from other school transcripts will not be included**
- If you have completed <u>16 or more</u> college units, but <u>fewer than 24</u> college units, at San Bernardino Valley College and have a <u>2.0 grade point average</u> or higher, your Re-established Valley College Grade Point Average will automatically be reported to the California Student Aid Commission. **Grades before 1981 and units from other school transcripts will not be included**
- Jet you have completed <u>fewer than 24</u> college units, you must have your high school verify your Grade Point Average. Request that your high school complete and submit a Cal Grant Program "Grade Point Average Verification Form" to the California Student Aid Commission.
- If you are a college student who has completed 24 or more units at another school, you must have that college/university verify your Grade Point Average. Request that college or university to electronically submit your grade point average information to the California Student Aid Commission.
- If you are a college student who has completed 24 or more units at another school and have official transcripts on file in the SBVC Records Office (or can provide official transcripts) or if you have SBVC grades before 1981 that you want included in your GPA, submit a request to the Records Office for them to determine if they can verify your Grade Point Average. **Units from other schools can be combined with SBVC units for the 24-unit total**
