


## San Bernardino Valley College (SBVC) California State University General Education (CSU GE) **Breadth Requirements**

SBVC may certify that a student has satisfied the minimum general education requirements of 39 lower division transfer units in accordance with CSU Executive Order 1100. Note: additional requirements for admission such as completion of at least 60 transferable units with a minimum GPA of 2.0 are also needed (refer to detailed CSU Admission requirements listed below).

- Courses from other California Community Colleges will be evaluated according to the CSU GE Breadth pattern of those
  - For out of state courses, the SBVC A&R Office will determine equivalency to SBVC courses.
  - Courses from foreign institutions may not be certified.
- For CSU GE Breadth certification purposes, students may use the catalog of entry or any catalog thereafter as long as continuous enrollment is maintained until transfer to CSU.

CSU defines continuous enrollment as one semester or two guarters in each calendar year.

Upon transfer, students will be required to complete at least nine units of upper-division general education courses
