

1998-1999 San Bernardino Valley College GRADUATION REQUIREMENT WORKSHEET

Graduates from San Bernardino Valley College receive an Associate of Arts Degree or an Associate of Science Degree.

Students must complete general education breadth requirements as specified below in Option #1 or Option #2 as well as additional units of electives and/or lower division requirements for a major.

Students must file an Intent to Graduate Petition during the Fall Semester for spring graduation and during Spring Semester for fall graduation. Check the school calendar for filling dates.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE OPTION #1

This general associate degree is designed for students planning to transfer to a four year institution.

The general education breadth can be fulfilled by completing either the California State University(CSU) Breadth Requirements or those of the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum(IGETC). Refer to the catalog (pages 34 or 32 respectively) for these requirements. In addition to this course work, students must fulfill these general requirements:

- ___ 1. Complete a minimum of 60 semester units of college work with at least 12 semester units in residence at San Bernardino Valley College.
- ___ 2. Earn a C(2.0) or higher in each course.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE OPTION #2

This general associate degree is designed for students planning to seek immediate employment after graduation or transfer to a four-year college or university. The general education requirements for this degree are listed below. In addition to this course work, students must fulfill these general requirements:

- ___ 1. Complete 60 units of college course work with at least 12 units in residence at SBVC.
- ___ 2. Earn an overall C (2.0) or higher grade point average.
- ___ 3. Complete 18 semester units of the course work listed for an Associate of Arts major or all of the courses listed for an Associate of Science major as outlined in Part III of the SBVC catalog.
- ___ 4. Demonstrate competency in English, mathematics and reading by satisfying the following criteria:
 - ___ a. Competency in English is demonstrated by completion of ENGL 015 or ENGL 101 with a grade of C (2.0) or higher.
 - ___ b. Competency in mathematics is demonstrated by:
 - ___ i. Completion of MATH 090 or a higher level course in mathematics or BUSCAL/ECON 208 with a grade of C or higher, or
 - ___ ii. Completion of a mathematics proficiency examination which is equivalent to a grade of C or higher,

or,

 - ___ iii. Completion of BUSCAL 091 or TECALC 137 with a grade of C or higher.
 - ___ c. Competency in reading is demonstrated by:
 - ___ i. Completion of READ 970#3, 100 or 101 with a grade of C or higher, or
 - ___ ii. Completion of all courses required to satisfy minimum graduation requirements in Categories I, II and III as listed with an overall grade point average of 2.0 or higher.
- ___ 5. Complete 24 or 26 of the 60 semester units total for graduation from the following five subject categories.

Category I. Natural Science (minimum: 4 semester units if a laboratory is included; otherwise 6 semester units).

Category IV. Communications and Learning Skills (minimum: 6 semester units)

- English composition is required of all students. Courses meeting this requirement are English 015 and English 101.
- Orientation 100 is required of all students taking 9 or more units in a semester. This course is to be completed within the student's first semesters of course work. New students are exempt from this requirement if they have already earned 30 units or more of college credit or they have already earned an associate or baccalaureate degree. Students on a career track within vocational disciplines that have articulate programs with four-year institutions may apply for an exemption through the Department Head and Division Chair of their area of study.

Category V. Physical and Health Education (minimum 2 semester units). Students are exempt from this requirement if they have been admitted to the Nursing Program, the Police Academy or the Sheriff's Academy. Veterans of the Armed Forces may have met this requirement; consult with a counselor. (Note: A maximum of 4 semester units of Physical Education activity can apply for graduation requirements.)
