Associate Degree (Graduation) Requirements

Graduates from San Bernardino Valley College (SBVC) receive an *Associate of Arts* degree or an *Associate of Science* degree. To earn an associate degree, students must complete general education breadth requirements specified in Option #1 or Option #2 below, as well as additional units of electives and/or lower division requirements for a major.

Associate Degree: Option #1

The Option 1 associate degrees are general degrees designed for students who plan to attend a four-year college or university.

Associate Degree: Option 1a

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC). Refer to the SBVC catalog for the IGETC requirements. In the process of completing this coursework the student must fulfill these general requirements:

1. Complete a minimum of 60 semester units of college coursework, with at least 12 semester units in residence at SBVC.
2. Earn a letter grade of C or higher in each course.

OR

Associate Degree: Option 1b

The California State University General Education-Breadth requirements (CSUGE). Refer to the SBVC catalog for the CSUGE requirements. In the process of completing this coursework the student must fulfill these general requirements:

1. Complete a minimum of 60 semester units of college coursework, with at least 12 semester units in residence at SBVC.
2. Earn at least a 2.0 grade point average for the CSUGE coursework. Earn a grade of C or better for each course in the Oral Communication, Written Communication, Critical Thinking and Mathematical/Quantitative Reasoning categories.

OR

Associate Degree: Option #2

The general associate Degree is designed for students planning to seek immediate employment after graduation. The general education breadth requirements for this degree are listed below:

1. Complete a minimum of 60 semester units of college coursework, with at least 12 semester units in residence at SBVC.
2. Earn an overall grade point average of C (2.00) or higher.
3. Complete 18 semester units of the coursework listed for an Associate of Arts major or all of the courses listed for an Associate in Science major as listed in Part III of the San Bernardino Valley College Catalog.
4. Demonstrate competency in English, mathematics and reading by satisfying the following criteria:

ENGL 015 or ENGL 101 with a grade of C or higher.

MATH 090, BUSCAL 091, TECALC 137, or a higher level course in mathematics with a grade of C or higher, or mathematics proficiency examination, which is equivalent to a comprehensive final examination MATH 090 with the equivalent to a grade of C or higher.

AND

READING 970x3, 100, or 101 with a grade of C or higher **or** completion of all courses required to satisfy minimum graduation requirements in Categories I, II, and III as listed below with an overall grade point average of 2.00 or higher.

5. Complete 24 to 26 of the 60 semester units needed for graduation from the five subject categories as listed below:

Category I: Natural Science (minimum: 4 semester units if a laboratory is included; otherwise 6 semester units). Courses

- Category IV: Communication and Learning Skills (minimum 6 semester units)**

ENGL 015 or ENGL 101

ORIENT 100 is required of all students taking nine (9) or more units per semester. This course must be completed within a student's first two semesters of coursework.

Exempt from this requirement if 30+ units of college credit or AA/AS or BA/BS degree

Career track students within vocational disciplines, which have articulated programs with four-year colleges or universities apply for an exemption through the Department Chair or Division Dean of the area of study.

NOTES:

1. Students file an *Intent to Graduate Petition* at the Records Office during the fall semester for spring graduation and during the spring semester for fall graduation. Check the school calendar in the *Schedule of Classes* for filing dates.
