


## SEMESTER IN SALAMANCA SPRING 2007

Citrus College's Semester in Spain provides a very enriching experience. Known as the "Oxford of the Spanish world," Salamanca draws students from around the world. Rising from the banks of the Tormes River, Salamanca is Spain's most graceful city. Its golden medieval buildings, Renaissance palaces and soaring cathedrals are tucked away in the northwest corner of old Castille, far from tourist crowds but only three hours from Madrid.

Earn 12-14 units of transferable credit in classes designed to enhance your study abroad experience. Most classes meet general education requirements. Airfare, accommodations, meal plan insurance, field trips and cultural activities are included in the program fee. Optional excursions are available. Financial aid is available to eligible students
