

Rolando Hernandez and Delfina Mendoza

Delfina Mendoza's father's death was a traumatic and devastating blow. Without any therapy or counseling, young Delfina blamed herself and her life took a turn that, unbeknownst to her, would lead her to a quarter-century of abusing drugs and alcohol.

A few short years later at age 21, Delfina was married and had a son named Kenny followed by a daughter named Karina. In 2003, Delfina's own 17-year old daughter confronted her mother about her addictive lifestyle.

The next day, on September 20, 2003, Delfina walked into Narcotics Anonymous meeting. Seven days later her husband followed and they embarked on the difficult journey to break free from addictions that held so much power over their lives.

Part of this journey led Delfina to return to school and she wanted to bring her nephew Rolando Hernandez with her. Rolando was also in recovery, had just been released from prison, and was a cancer survivor.

'My Aunt Delfina said it was time for us to do something with our lives and she wanted both of us to go to college, Rolando said. "I was content to just hang around and collect Social Security and didn't know if I could do it after being in jail, and recovering from my addictions and cancer," Rolando

In October of 2005, they shrugged off the challenges of their collective past and set out on a new journey as college students at San Bernardino Valley College. Rolando and Delfina (age 29 and 43, respectively, at the time) both enrolled in Human Services classes and later joined the Puente Program.

"On the cover of the course catalogs at SBVC, it says 'Your future starts here' and it's really true," Rolando said. "It was hard to balance being a student with my fears, but I learned to live life to the fullest every day after surviving cancer because there's no promise of tomorrow."







Jasmine Kotsay

On Monday, August 18, 2008, Jasmine Kotsay was one of thousands of new San Bernardino Valley College students finding their way around an unfamiliar campus on the first day of Fall semester classes. Navigating the sidewalks and hallways in search of classrooms, hunting for the nearest restrooms and selecting textbooks in the Bookstore are just a few of the stress-laden challenges that test the motivated spirit of a new student embracing the first few days of a fresh school year.

Now try to do it with your eyes closed. And then again the next day. And the day after that.

After getting connected with Disabled Student Programs & Services (DSP&S) and the DSP&S High Tech Center, many of her fears were eased as professors accommodated Jasmine's needs. All of her math exercises were Brailled (translated into Braille) and she was able to listen to her textbooks on CD as she adjusted to what she knew would be a heavy academic workload.

"I reminded myself of the same thing I tell other people—that just because you're blind, it doesn't mean you can't live," Jasmine said. "Blindness is not what defines me, yet there are many things that do."

For Jasmine, one of those defining qualities is the desire to help teach children who are blind. Because of the positive impact that teachers had on her life as a child, Jasmine's goal is to earn liberal arts and special education degrees to return the favor for future generations.

"I love to help people and I feel like I can be a good asset to somebody who wants to learn," Jasmine said. "My parents, who are both SBVC graduates, have pushed me to go after my dreams and do whatever I need to do in order to fulfill them. My parents and teachers said I can do anything I put my mind to, and I want to share that with my students someday too."

"My parents never told me that I had a disease and I don't see it as a disability," Jasmine said. "Of course there are things that I can't do, but, then again, there are things that lots of people can't do."






