C. Schedule Description:

Assigned projects involving research, laboratory work, or directed study for selected students who are interested in furthering their knowledge of anatomy and physiology on an independent study basis. Enrollment limited to those who meet independent study criteria. Prior to registration, a contract must be prepared. See instructor for details.

- A. guided investigation
- B. suggested reading
- C. mentoring
- D. review, comment, and feedback, both orally and in writing
- experiments, demonstrations, reports, or other work products as deemed appropriate by the instructor.

VI. TYPICAL ASSIGNMENTS:

A. Reading Assignments

Selected assignments as deemed appropriate by the instructor.

- B. Writing Assignments
 - 1. Draft written progress reports during the semester. (An oral report may be substituted as the discretion of the instructor.)
 - 2. A final written project report of composition and format as determined by the instructor.

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VII. EVALUATION:

The method of evaluation will be specified by the instructor in the contract agreement between the student and instructor. At a minimum these will include:

- A. Regular progress reports by the student to the instructor either orally or in writing.
