## I. CATALOG DESCRIPTION

PHT 043 Pharmacy Clinical Experience

20 hours clinical experience = 4 units

Includes application of the distribution and dispensing of medications in a pharmacy under the direct supervision of a pharmacist. Emphasizes inventory control and repackaging systems. Prerequisite: PHT 030 and PHT 031

Prerequisite/Corequisite: PHT 041

Corequisite: PHT 042

## III EXPECTED OUTCOMES FOR STUDENTS

Upon completion of the course the student should be able to:

- A. Repackage and label 25 unit doses from a bulk supply of drugs and correctly complete all necessary control records including pharmacist check before releasing for patient use.
- B. Read and interpret a prescription and medication orders, select correct drug, select correct dosage, select appropriate container, type correct label and use final pharmacist check before release.
- C. Determine if route, form and dosage consistent with drug order.
- D. Demonstrate ability to calculate accurate dosages.
- E. Demonstrate the ability to use a computer system for labeling and pricing as needed.
- F. Prepare intravenous admixtures, using sterile technic and appropriate labeling.
- G. Demonstrate the ability to interact with individuals from a variety of cultural backgrounds.
- H. Accurately check in drug order, maintain inventory control records and initiate ordering of drugs and supplies when needed.
