Course ID:       **ECON 200H**  
Course Title:    Introduction to Macroeconomics - Honors  
Units:            3  
Lecture:         3 Hours  
Laboratory:     None  
Prerequisite:    None

Introduction to macroeconomic theory and the role of fiscal and monetary policies in economics with special emphasis on national economic problems. Enrollment is limited to students eligible for the Honors Program.

*Associate Degree Applicable*

*Effective: FA 2003*

*Rationale: UCLA, UCI, and UCR use honors courses as a criteria for priority admission of Valley College students. SBVC has a formal, signed agreement for the UCLA Transfer Alliance Program (TAP). A criteria for TAP membership is that a breadth of honors courses, such Econ 200H meet major preparation requirements.*

Course ID:       **ENGL 102H**  
Course Title:    Intermediate Composition and Critical Thinking - Honors  
Units:            4  
Lecture:         4 Hours  
Laboratory:     None  
Prerequisite:    ENGL 101 or ENGL 101H

Further work in the expository and argumentative essay with emphasis on the critical examination of literature and on analytical and explicatory writing. Enrollment is limited to students eligible for the Honors Program.

*Associate Degree Applicable*

*Effective: FA 2003*

*Rationale: The English Department does not currently have a honors section of English 102. This course will enhance the Honors Program by allowing students to complete both their English 101 and English 102 in an honors format. UC requires one year of English composition for transfer students. These courses thus satisfy both honors program requirements but also transfer as general education requirements.*

Course ID:       **POLICE 017**  
Course Title:    Mounted Patrol Update  
Units:            .50  
Lecture:         4 hours per semester  
Laboratory:     12 hours per semester  
Prerequisite:    POLICE 015

This course is designed to update mounted personnel about patrol functions and new techniques to control their mounts in various situations. Horse and rider will be exposed to crowd control, congested areas and noise/structured distractions.

*Rationale: Mounted personnel in San Bernardino County and the surrounding areas need training in mounted patrol procedures and updates. Mounted personnel work in various situations and it is essential that the deputies receive updated training on new techniques.*

Course ID: **POLICE 036**  
Course Title: Survival Spanish for Law Enforcement  
Units: .25 unit  
Lecture: 4 hours per semester  
Laboratory: 4 hours per semester  
Prerequisites: CRMJUS 058

Course enables students to acquire skills to facilitate communication with Spanish speaking members of the community. This course emphasizes phrases specific to officer safety. Focus is on practical phrases, commands and questions needed by law enforcement in commonly encountered field situations.

*Associate Degree Applicable*

*Effective: SP 2003*

*Rationale: This course is designed to enhance the ability of law enforcement agencies to respond to, recognize and effectively use the Spanish language in emergency situations to converse and understand possible violent subjects and citizens in need. This course will also enhance awareness of victim and community needs in dealing with Spanish speaking persons.*

	Change Catalog and Schedule Description	To: Develops comprehension and communication skills in Spanish for medical personnel working with Spanish speaking patients. Presents interview questions and basic medical terminology and general cultural information essential in the job performance.
<b>SPAN 158</b>	SPANISH FOR NATIVE SPANISH SPEAKERS	
	Change Catalog and Schedule Description	To: Designed for students who already communicate in Spanish and who want to develop and strengthen reading and writing skills, with special emphasis on vocabulary expansion, verbs, grammar, spelling, punctuation, and cultural applications of the Spanish language. Emphasis is on correct usage of standard Spanish. Course is conducted primarily in Spanish, producing skills equivalent to Spanish 103.
