Course Title: Criminal Law  
Units: 3  
Lecture: 48 Hours per semester

The historical development and theories associated with criminal law and its contemporary application. This course will focus on the relationship between criminal law and the criminal justice system. Classification of crimes and their application to the criminal justice system will also be covered in the course. **ENROLLMENT IS LIMITED TO THOSE STUDENTS WHO MEET THE SCREENING REQUIREMENTS AS OUTLINED IN THE GOVERNMENT CODE, PENAL CODE AND THE COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING ADMINISTRATIVE MANUAL.**

This course will address the origin, concepts and philosophy of evidence, search and seizure, degrees of evidence, case studies, evidence procedures, judicial theories and decisions interpreting individual rights. **ENROLLMENT IS LIMITED TO THOSE STUDENTS WHO MEET THE SCREENING REQUIREMENTS AS OUTLINED IN THE GOVERNMENT CODE, CALIFORNIA PENAL CODE AND THE COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING ADMINISTRATIVE MANUAL.**

Course ID: **POLICE 103**  
Course Title: Introduction to Criminal Investigation  
Units: 3  
Lecture: 48 Hours per semester  
Laboratory: None  
Prerequisite: None  
Corequisites: POLICE 002, POLICE 100, POLICE 101 and POLICE 102

This course will address the examination of crime, evidence and police procedures in investigating crime. This includes organized crime, street crime and white-collar crime. **ENROLLMENT IS LIMITED TO THOSE STUDENTS WHO MEET SCREENING REQUIREMENTS AS OUTLINED IN THE GOVERNMENT CODE, CALIFORNIA PENAL CODE AND THE COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING ADMINISTRATIVE MANUAL.**

*Rationale for all new POLICE courses: Currently, the Basic Law Enforcement Academy (Police 001) is 896 hours in length and each student receives 30 college units from San Bernardino Valley College. The 30 units received from the college can only be used as electives if the student transfers to the CSU system. The Basic Law Enforcement Academy is being modified and four separate criminal justice courses were created. Each of the new courses is 48 hours in length and each student receives three units. Students will take the four new courses in conjunction with the modified Basic Law Enforcement Academy. The new courses are designed to be transferable as pre-transfer major classes to California State University San Bernardino. Following a needs assessment conducted statewide by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST), the Commission directed the development of this curriculum to satisfy the requirements for a Basic Law Enforcement Certificate. POST has mandated this training for this specific population, including content and requirement hours.*

Course ID: **POLIT 110H**  
Course Title: Introduction to Political Theory - **Honors**  
Units: 3  
Lecture: 3 Hours per week  
Laboratory: None  
Prerequisite: None

This course **utilizes selected primary texts to survey** Western political thought from classical times to the contemporary period, and explores such controversial political questions as the nature of justice, the morality of political deception and violence, the proper limits of governmental power, the virtues (and challenges) of political diversity, and the future of the bourgeois state. **Enrollment is limited to students eligible for the Honors Program.**

Topics include the historical context of the motion picture industry and its relevance to the contemporary viewer, the aesthetics of film, the director, and the studio system.

Change Description	To: Basic training for new Law Enforcement Officers including administration of justice, patrol procedures, firearms, defensive tactics, physical training, First Aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), traffic investigation, water safety, and driver training. <b>Enrollment is limited to those students who meet state screening requirements as outlined in the Government Code, California Penal Code and the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training Administrative Manual.</b>

*Rationale: Currently, the Basic Law Enforcement Academy (POLICE 001) is 896 hours in length and each student receives 30 college units from San Bernardino Valley College. However, the 30 college units can only be used as electives if the student transfers to the CSU/UC system. The Basic Law Enforcement Academy is being modified and four separate criminal justice courses were created (POLICE 100, 101, 102, and 103.) The modification of the existing course includes the deletion of 192 lecture hours from the previous curriculum. This change in curriculum will allow the 192 lecture hours or 12 units to be transferable to California State University San Bernardino. The modified Basic Law Enforcement Academy will consist of 704 hours of POST approved law enforcement training.*

*In order to obtain a Basic Peace Officer Certificate, each student must enroll and complete the modified Basic Law Enforcement Academy and the four separate criminal justice courses. The courses must be taken together as corequisites.*

*Following a needs assessment conducted statewide by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST), the Commission directed the development of this curriculum to satisfy the requirements of the Basic Law Enforcement Certificate. POST has mandated this training for this specific population, including content and requirement hours.*

## MODIFY CERTIFICATES

### **BASIC LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY CERTIFICATE**

This certificate is designed for state certified entry-level positions in law enforcement agencies. Successful completion of this program and subsequent completion of the hiring agencies probationary period in a Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) certified agency qualifies the student for a California POST certificate. This program meets Penal Code Section 832 requirement of training as a peace officer in the state of California. This program is offered in two formats: the Intensive Format (approximately 23 weeks) and the Extended Format (approximately 48 weeks).
