The Liberal Arts major is an interdisciplinary major that exposes students to various academic disciplines and includes courses from the Sciences, Social Sciences and Humanities. The major is intended for students who want to transfer to a university, or for students who want a general Associate of Arts Degree that reflects broad-based interests rather than the more narrow focus of other majors.

Students may obtain an Associate of Arts Degree in Liberal Arts by completing a minimum of 60 semester units of coursework (of these 60 units, a minimum of 12 units must be taken at SBVC) in addition to meeting one of the following criteria:

1. Completion of all CSU General Education-Breadth requirements, as described on pages 36-37 of the college catalog; or
2. Completion of all IGETC requirements for either the University of California or the California State University systems, as described on pages 34-35 of the college catalog; or
3. Completion of the requirements for Associate Degree Option 2, as described on page 32 of the college catalog, plus 18 additional units from Category I (Natural Science), Category II (Social and Behavioral Science) and Category III (Humanities).
