Students will be taught methods to de-escalate and control situations that have the potential for violence.</p>	FA06	The 8-hour law enforcement response to the mentally ill course is designed to provide patrol officers with a basic knowledge of the signs and symptoms associated with mental illness and developmental disabilities. Typically, Instructors will spend approximately one-half hour on each illness or disability to provide officers with basic signs and symptoms. The need to identify, control and de-escalate potentially violent situations will aid in officer survival, liability, danger to the public and improved methods for handling persons who are mentally ill.
POLICE 069	<p>Course ID: POLICE 069 Course Title: Traffic Reconstruction Investigation Units: 4 Lecture: 56 hours per semester Laboratory: 24 hours per semester Prerequisite: POLICE 074</p> <p>Catalog and Schedule Description: This is an advance technical course that includes higher mathematics, physics, momentum theories, vehicle dynamics, reconstruction methodology and motorcycle, auto-pedestrian/bicycle, and heavy duty articulated vehicle collision analysis. Accident training has primarily been centered on the principles of physics and math but new technology increases the need for up to date training.
