CD 115	Course Title: Health, Safety and Nutrition for Young Children Units: 3 Lecture: 3 contact hours per week Laboratory: None. Prerequisite: None. It examines preventive health care policies and basic care procedures; safety measures for secure, high quality environments and educational experiences; and it underscores children's nutritional needs for optimal physical and cognitive development. Schedule Description: This course concentrates on the essential aspects of the health, safety and nutritional concerns for children in early education programs. Equates with CHC's CD 115	FA08	The California Community College Early Childhood Education Curriculum Alignment project has worked to align 24 units of EC/CD lower-division coursework, across the state, in order to set the requirements for the Teacher Level Child Development Permit. Their recommendation is to have a Health, Safety and Nutrition for Children course rather than two courses, which we have, CD231 Health and Safety Practices for Children and CD232 Nutrition for Young Children. We need to be aligned with other community colleges. The two other courses, CD231 and CD232 will be deleted from the Child Development program and certificates.
CD 245	Course Title: Early Intervention and Inclusion Units: 3 Lecture: 3 contact hours per week Laboratory: None. Prerequisite: CD 244. Corequisite: CD 215. Catalog Description: This course focuses on theories, research and practical teaching strategies in early intervention and early childhood special education. Students learn intervention techniques and strategies to work with children with disabilities and other special needs. Schedule Description: This course focuses on theories, research and practical teaching strategies in early intervention and early childhood special education.	FA08	The Community College Paraprofessional Preparation Project (CCPPP)in collaboration with the Office of the Chancellor for Community Colleges of California, has requested that Community College Child Development Departments create a certificate for an Early Intervention Assistant II. We have followed the competencies set out in the CCPPP's guidelines to create this course. We have also included the recommendations from our Early Intervention Assistant II Advisory Board. The San Bernardino Child Care Planning Council has also found that there is a need for this certificate in our community. We are adding this course (CD 245)as well as an Internship in Early Intervention and Inclusion course (CD 215) for the certificate. These courses and certificate articulate with Cal Baptist University's BA degree in Early Intervention.

POLIT 204	Course Title: Introduction to World Politics Units: 3 Lecture: 3 contact hours per week. Laboratory: None. Prerequisite: None. Departmental Advisories: POLIT 100 or HIST 171. Catalog Description: This introductory course in world politics (international relations) surveys the principal actors, issues and processes involved in international relations. It includes paradigms and approaches in the study of world politics; foreign policy; issues of war and peace; international organizations; international law; globalization; international political economy, including global financial and trade institutions; human rights; and the global environment with respect to sustainable development. Schedule Description: An introduction to world politics (international relations), this course surveys the major actors, processes and issues that inform international relations, including foreign policy, war and peace, international organizations, global political economy, human rights, international law, the global environment, and sustainable development.
