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DISCUSSION

- SB 1440 or Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act** - Larry lead the discussion on implementation of SB 1440. Three Transfer Model Curricula (TMCs) are now available in Communication Studies, Psychology, and Sociology. Out of the three TMCs, Cindy Parish suggested submitting the Sociology degree. SBVC does not teach Research Methods which is required for the Psychology TMC. The Communication Studies TMC does not align with CSUSB and Cal Poly Pomona, the two major transfer CSUs. Shortly, a second group of TMCs will be approved by the Statewide Academic Senate for Administration of Justice/Criminal Justice, Kinesiology/Physical Education, and Mathematics. SBVC needs to submit two TMCs to be compliant with SB1440. Descriptors for TMCs are available at the C-ID website <http://www.c-id.net>
- C-ID (Course Identification Number System) Project** - C-ID is a descriptor-based common course identification number system. It is a joint project between the CCC Statewide Academic Senate, CSU Academic Senate, and independent colleges and universities. After discipline courses are given a C-ID number based on an approved course description, CCCs will be invited to submit course outlines to be approved for a C-ID. The designated campus Articulation Officer is responsible for the submission of courses. Faculty responsibilities include review of course descriptors during the discipline review cycles. An upcoming meeting is scheduled on March 11, 2011 to convene the following discipline groups: Business, Management, Marketing, Accounting, Studio Art, English, Economics, Computer Systems, Information Systems, Political Science, Music, and Math.
