What is a C-ID?

C-ID Descriptors have been developed for general use after a statewide review by the discipline faculty who teach these courses in California's public post-secondary institutions.

The descriptors are offered to **encourage wider articulation** and to expand the lower division curricular offerings and thereby increase the variety—and ensure the rigor—of our many Community College courses.

Remember that the content, objectives, and pre and co-requisites of all C-ID descriptors reflect the minimum standards expected in a college's Course Outline of Record (COR). While the COR must meet all of these standards as included in the C-ID descriptor, colleges may certainly go beyond the descriptor and include additional content or higher requirements. Likewise, the specific course title on the C-ID descriptor is advisory, and courses may be approved as meeting the descriptor if they have different but relevant titles. In addition, although colleges may require more units than is required by a descriptor, unit restrictions based on SB 1440 will still apply if the course is included in a TMC-aligned degree.

How do I locate FINAL DESCRIPTORS pertaining to my discipline?

1. Click on "Descriptors"
2. Click on "View Final Descriptors"
3. Click on your department name: (Example: Communication Studies). You will notice that 9 C-IDs are available for Communication Studies.
4. Click on a course to view finalized descriptor and compare it with our local Course Outline Record. This should take place anytime you are submitting a course to Curriculum.
5. If a C-ID can be identified for one of your courses, we must work towards aligning with it for articulation purposes.

1. Click on COURSE REVIEW
2. Click on VIEW SUBMITTED COURSES
3. Select your department and click on FILTER. You will be provided with a list of courses that have been submitted and their status.

SB 751 (Yee) – Amending Section 54953, To Require Reporting Of Actions Taken And The Vote Of Each Member Present

SB 751 added subsection (c)(2) to Section 54953. Under this new provision, legislative bodies of local agencies must publicly report: (1) any action taken and (2) the vote or abstention on each action taken by each member present for the action at a meeting.

The impetus behind the bill apparently stemmed from local agencies with large legislative bodies where the absence of either a roll-call vote or a specific tally and report of the votes of each member caused difficulty for members of the public to determine who voted for or against a measure. Specifically, throughout the legislative history, the bill's analyses refer to the minutes of a meeting of the Association of Bay Area Governments that reported a motion was received by "27 ayes and 5 nays," without listing the votes of the individual members. SB 751 enhances the public's ability to monitor meetings of local agencies and individual members' votes. Previously, the Brown Act only required local agencies to report the vote or abstention of every member present for closed meetings or for meetings that utilized teleconferencing.

While this new disclosure requirement may readily be addressed when a roll-call vote is taken at a meeting and recorded in the minutes, there are many "actions taken" at meetings, particularly with respect to minor matters, that are done by consent or minute action, which can take various forms ranging from a nodding of heads to vocal affirmation. SB 751 does not expressly provide that all votes must be taken by a formal "roll-call," but such an interpretation could be implied in order to satisfy the new vote-reporting requirement of this provision. Until the Legislature or courts provide further clarification on this issue, we recommend that when action is taken by any means other than a roll-call vote at a meeting, that the names of each individual who dissented or abstained be stated so that there is a clear record of how the entire body voted. This information should also be included in the minutes of the meeting.

Following this procedure will avoid the delay inherent in roll-call votes, while ensuring compliance with the stated intent of SB 751.
