Student to student contact will be through weekly threaded discussions, peer to peer feedback, synchronous online meetings and in the face to face labs.

8. Describe what students in this online version of the course will do in a typical week on this class. Include the process starting after initial log in.

A typical week in this course will be the students will attend face to face lab class on Mondays while the lecture portion is fully online. The student would attend the weekly zoom lecture that will take place Tuesdays at 1:00pm. The student would login to see the weekly modules and what they entail. Read the material suggested, look over any instructor created material, and videos. The student would then submit the assignments in a timely manner. Lastly the students would engage in the weekly discussion and give peer to peer feedback.

9. Provide a sample statement that could be included in the syllabus for this course that communicates to students the frequency and timeliness of instructor-initiated contact and student feedback.

This is an online Hybrid course and will meet once weekly online and once each Monday for on campus laboratory hands-on. This course will require the student to have a computer with a camera or a smart phone to turn in take part in the weekly zoom lecture and turn in weekly assignments. The syllabus for the course is designed to assist the student throughout the course. The instructor will provide timely feedback on assignments, exams and in the face to face lab.

For face to face portion of this course you will need an NSF approved knife set, black pants (no jeans), Culinary Arts white chef jacket with SBVC culinary arts logo, a white kitchen apron, black chef's hat and slip resistant shoes. These items are required for this course.

This course will include student to student discussions and peer to peer evaluations. Other student to student interaction will take place in the zoom lectures and in the face to face labs.

11. Provide a specific example of how regular and effective instructor-student interaction may occur in this online course.

This course ensures regular and effective instructor -student contact in the following ways: Synchronous office hours three days a week, Synchronous lectures set up on a normal schedule once a week. Announcements sent out each Monday. Instructor prepared demonstrations, and materials and posted videos. The instructor will give timely feedback on class projects (lab work), and assignments daily. Instructor to student interaction will also take place with instructor-initiated feedback with each student at least twice a week, during office hours, feedback on assignments and in answering questions and concerns students may have. The instructor will also send out an welcome letter to all students one week before class starts to encourage students, and give students vital information regarding the course they are about to enter.

Lab hours will take place face to face on Mondays.
