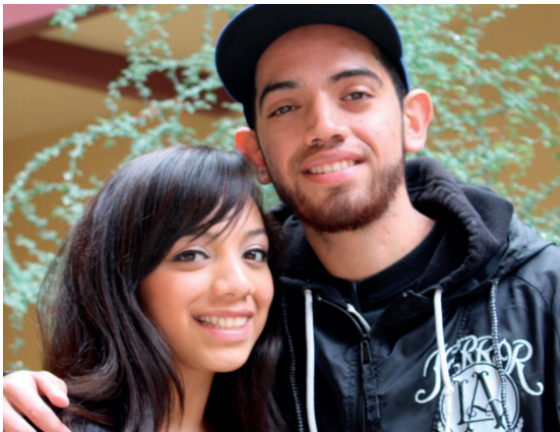

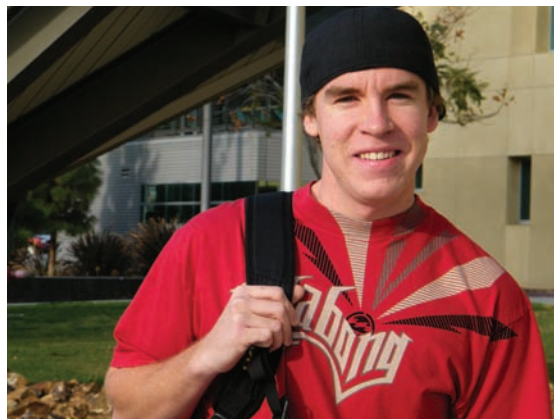

How To Be Considered For The Valley-Bound Commitment

- ◆ Submit a SBVC Admissions application online, Valley-Bound Commitment application, 1,000 word essay showing how the program will help you achieve your dreams through education, high school transcripts and photo
- ◆ Attend one of the 12 designated high schools for all of 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grades and graduate with a high school diploma
- ◆ Meet economically disadvantaged level by applying for financial aid and complete all financial aid requirements (www.fafsa.ed.gov)
- ◆ Be recognized as "financial aid eligible" by the SBVC Financial Aid office
- ◆ Enroll as a full-time SBVC student (12+ units)
- ◆ Take the assessment test and enroll in basic skills courses as determined by the assessment test
- ◆ Enroll in Student Development courses to ensure seamless transition into college
- ◆ Maintain a college GPA of at least 2.0
- ◆ Serve 30 hours of community service over two semesters

AB540 Students

- ◆ Submit a SBVC Admissions application online, Valley-Bound Commitment application, 1,000 word essay showing how the program will help you achieve your dreams through education, high school transcripts and photo
- ◆ Meet economic disadvantaged level as determined by completing the Valley Bound application
