1. Provide a rationale for your request (Give a detailed explanation of why this budget increase is needed.)

The history department currently has NO yearly budget. We are offered "leftover" funds at the end of the yearly funding cycle, and give two weeks notice and a limited amount for purchases. In the past, we had a \$1000 budget, but when we went through difficult times under a past administration, my funds were combined into a division budget. No one ever explained how or why that happened.

We need a yearly budget for two things: to support access to up to date curricular materials (new documentaries—streaming access or DVD, for example), and to support our faculty in attending both History conferences and educational leadership conferences. We need access to current curricular materials because historical interpretations evolve with the discovery/access to new primary documentation of events. Racial and ethnic minority groups have been historically omitted from core text representation. By providing students with current curricular materials, we are engaging them in issues of the past that reflect their personal realities and experiences. Additionally, faculty in this department attend multiple conferences and therefore exceed the amount provided for them in professional development. Conference attendance is critical for our faculty to keep up to date with historical trends and interpretations, and in order to represent our college on a statewide level.

According to the data provided, the History Department generated 358.67 FTES in 2018-2019 (and an additional 49 FTES in the respective summer sessions for that academic year), which total over 400 FTES for the year. We have three full time faculty and 17 adjunct faculty. Our goals include providing training for

our faculty and expanding our sections for Chicano, Racial and Ethnic Minorities, and African American history to serve our diverse community of learners. We seek to expand our support and offerings for the Tumaini program and our representation for Umoja (statewide) conferences. Additionally, we will research developing an Ethnic Studies program. All of these goals tie into our request for additional funds for new curricular materials and funding for conference attendance.
