Here is what the student government has accomplished and is planning currently:

<u>Patriot Day</u>. On Tuesday, September 13, 2005, at 12:00 noon in the SBVC Library Viewing Room, the ASB co-sponsored a commemoration to honor those people lost in the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. We distributed clutch flag pins to participants. The College Singers performed under the direction of Ms. Matty Scully, who also gave brief histories of the songs offered. We also collected donations for survivors of Hurricane Katrina.

Constitution Day. On Monday, September 19 at noon in the Library Viewing Room, the ASB co-sponsored an informative program on the Constitution of the United States. Professor Ed Gomez and Doctor Dan Walker offered different perspectives of the Constitution.

<u>Indigenous Peoples Month</u>. During the month of October the MEChA Club celebrated the indigenous people and cultures throughout the world. There were lectures and film shown every Monday that showed how various cultures evolved. On October 12, they hosted a special celebration in the Greek Theatre from 6:00-9:00 p.m. that included dancers, music, speakers and food.

Red Ribbon and Disability Awareness Week. The ASB will sponsor this during the week of October 24-27, 2005. There will be a graphic display of a crashed car supplied by MADD. There will also be a booths set up in the Quad and Campus Center throughout the week, staffed with Human Service Club and class representatives who will be encouraging other students to sign cards pledging to remain drug, alcohol and tobacco free for the week. Additionally, there will be HIV testing, blood bank, and disability simulation exercises along with adapted equipment displays.
