ASB Sticker

The ASB Sticker is a discount program that allows students to receive discounted prices and rates provided by local businesses that support San Bernardino Valley College students. Revenues from the \$5 sticker are used to fund scholarships, activities and programming, as well as the Textbook Rental Program.

ASB Stickers may be purchased online when registering for classes or directly from the Campus Business Office (ADSS 206) or the Bookstore (Campus Center). If you paid your fees online and included the cost of the sticker in your purchase, print out a receipt to obtain your sticker. Discounts include 5% off all items at the Bookstore (except software). Cyber Lounge

The ASG Cyber Lounge offers 13 computer stations located on the 1st floor of the Campus Center. The Cyber Lounge provides the Microsoft Office 2003 Suite, as well as internet access. The Cyber Lounge is a great place to go to check email, register for classes, or surf the internet! In addition, workshops are offered to teach students how to check their campus email or trouble shoot computer problems.

Student Lounge

Eligibility Requirements

All officers and representatives of the ASG shall meet the following minimum qualifications for candidacy:

- ★ Be enrolled in a minimum of five units at San Bernardino Valley College and maintain that level throughout their term of office.
- ★ Maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 (as determined by semester grades) for their entire term of office.
- ★ Be available to attend ASG meetings
- ★ Be a student in good standing.
- ★ Students who have previously served on ASG for three years or more may not apply.

Services and Programs

Textbook Rental Program

In partnership with the SBVC Bookstore, students have the opportunity to rent the textbook at a significantly reduced rate in lieu of purchasing the textbook. Students sign a Rental Agreement, pay a small fee, and return their books at the end of each semester. The titles for the Textbook Rental Program are limited; however, more titles are added each year.
